Call for Specimens Routine for Museum

Champaign, Ill.—(U.P.)—A call for 1,000 specimens ranging from seashells to salamanders was a matter of routine for the natural history museum of the University of Illinois.

Dr. Donald Hoffmeister, museum curator, and his assistant, Mrs. Philip Smith, were prepared by previous experience to fill this request from three book illustrators.

They once received a call "for all the frogs you can send me from Illinois." A query about the proper treatment for a boa constrictor with diphtheria was another earlier problem.

So, the 1000-specimen deal was undertaken with dispatch, and seashells by the hundreds, 75 snakes, 65 frogs, 40 lizards and 48 salamanders were sent to the illustrators.

Among the specimens also were some frog skeletons about half the size of a matchstick and far more fragile. Hoffmeister and Mrs. Smith had to wrap them in tissues and then pack them in cotton-filled boxes.

On one restless night "a flash of heat lightning revealed, just a few feet from our tent, a man with an ax on his shoulder," Gilliard writes. "I yelled, flicked my torch—and he was gone like a ghost. It happened again on another night."

Ornithologist Explores Dying New Guinea Culture

Washington — In swamps of New Guinea's Sepik river live tribesmen who once proclaimed "a man who has not killed is nothing."

Westerners seldom venture into the dangerous fever-plagued land of former head-hunters, whose dying culture remains one of mankind's most interesting curiosities. Last year ornithologist E. Thomas Gilliard, associate curator of birds, American Museum of Natural History, and his wife stayed three months among the tribesmen.

Strange Sights, Sounds
Before the expedition ended with a bag of 220 different species of birds — some extremely rare—frights, hardships and surprises piled up. One night a crocodile crawled to within 20 feet of Gilliard's bed. Often the jungle resounded to nocturnal lashing and snorting of other animals.

On one restless night "a flash of heat lightning revealed, just a few feet from our tent, a man with an ax on his shoulder," Gilliard writes. "I yelled, flicked my torch—and he was gone like a ghost. It happened again on another night."

"Sometimes it was the thing we couldn't fathom which worried us most—vague undercurrents of bitterness and hatred that rippled along the river, mutterings of an itinerant boatman, tense rumblings of the slit gongs."

With those ancient hardwood drums, some shaped with stone adzes and axes, Sepik valley villages maintain a communication system linking some 350 persons. The loudest slip gongs can be "read" five miles away.

Curious folkways bind the villagers' lives. Tribal law is enforced with bizarre ghost shows. Husbands buy their wives.

Virtually everyone gets married in the middle of Sepik valley. A man cannot manage his affairs without a wife, and prefers three or four if he can afford them. At home, however, even a feared tribal chieftain is just another husband. One

such reprimanded his nagging wife for stealing wood. She threw a yam at his head and broke his chin shield. Superstitions Rampant

Carvings embody both art and superstition. Encountering huge carved faces and doll-like images called marsalai, Gilliard reports: "Each marsalai had a special name and represented the dreaded spirit of a particular whirlpool, swamp or bog. Placed in strategic spots, they are believed to absorb the anger of their respective demons and divert it from mankind."

The villagers' persisting enemy, mosquitoes, harassed the expedition. There were lovelier flights of crowned pigeons, largest in the world and seemingly doomed to extinction by stupidity. When one of a flock is shot, others hover sympathetically around to become easy targets.

In the Prince Albert Mountains bushmen captured huge flying foxes, earth's largest flying mammals. The expedition, first zoological exploration of the Hindenburg and Victor Emanuel ranges, also photographed a twelve-wired bird of paradise on its nest — fist such photograph on record.
