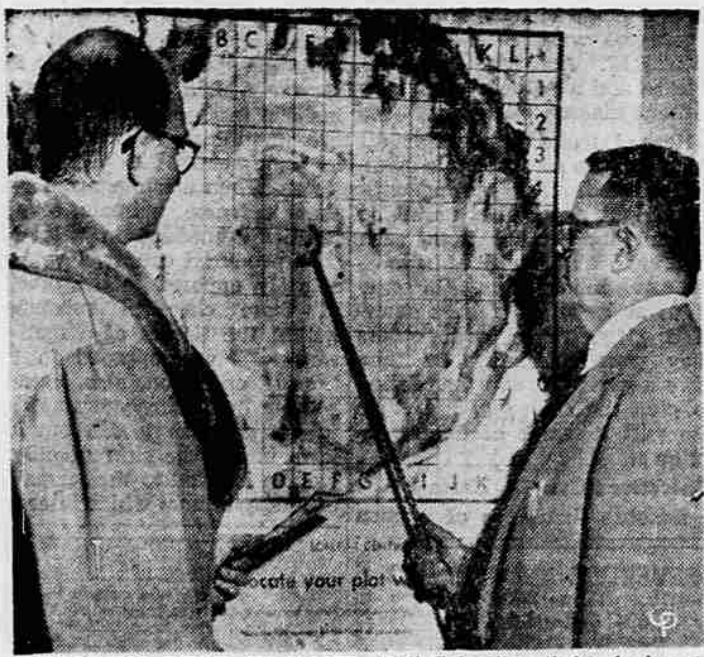

Morocco Debate Ban Wins Support of US

United Nations, N.Y. — (U.P.) — The United States supported 31 members of powerful Arab-Asian and Latin American blocs today in their proposal to kill debate on France's relations with Morocco.

The 31 countries made their proposal formally in the General Assembly's Main Political Committee. It was regarded as a move to clear the last obstacle to France's removal from its agenda the Algerian question, which caused the French to walk out of the Assembly Sept. 30. Although the French announced that they would return, now that the Algerian question was disposed of. In previous years, French delegates have stayed out of the debate on Morocco.

Madras — (U.P.) — The fate of Pelton dam, under consideration as a major hydroelectric development in Jefferson county since 1949, will hinge on an election planned Saturday, Dec. 10, at the Warm Springs Indian reservation, it was reported today.

Bulganin's Talk Raps Portugal

Madras, India — (U.P.) — Soviet Premier Nikolai Bulganin made another open bid to woo India into the Communist camp today by denouncing Portugal for retaining colonies on the Indian subcontinent.

Cyprus Troops Get Wartime Status

Nicosia, Cyprus — (U.P.) — Britain today gave wartime status to 12,000 troops in this Mediterranean island colony to crush savage terrorism which has killed six British soldiers in recent days.

Showdown Seen In Aircraft Feud

Washington — (U.P.) — The Air Force-Army feud over the Army's expanding aircraft fleet appeared headed today for a showdown before Defense Secretary Charles E. Wilson.

The battle has erupted because the Army wants to use its air arm more and the Air Force suspects the Army is trying to establish an air force of its own.

The Army, while denying any intent to duplicate the combat jobs of the Air Force, is bent on getting changes made in a 1952 agreement which it regards as gravely restricting its flying rights.

The Air Force suspects that the senior service aims eventually to establish a new air force of its own.

Army Secretary Wilber M. Brucker said last week that his service is interested only in relatively slow-flying and low-flying unarmed aircraft. But that didn't quiet Air Force concern.

The controversy broke into the open last week when Air Secretary Donald A. Quarles disclosed he had overruled an Air Force general and permitted the Army to test a new aviation unit in the Louisiana war games. But in doing so, Quarles stated emphatically that the "underlying issue" of Army and Air Force doctrine remains.

Crescent City Man Drowns in River

Crescent City, Calif. — (U.P.) — A Crescent City, Calif., man drowned yesterday when his boat overturned in the Smith river, sheriff's officers reported today.

The victim was W. H. McGargar, Crescent City merchant. His fishing partner, Robert Young, was taken to a local hospital for treatment for shock and exposure.

The capsizing occurred about noon at Peacock Hole on the Smith.

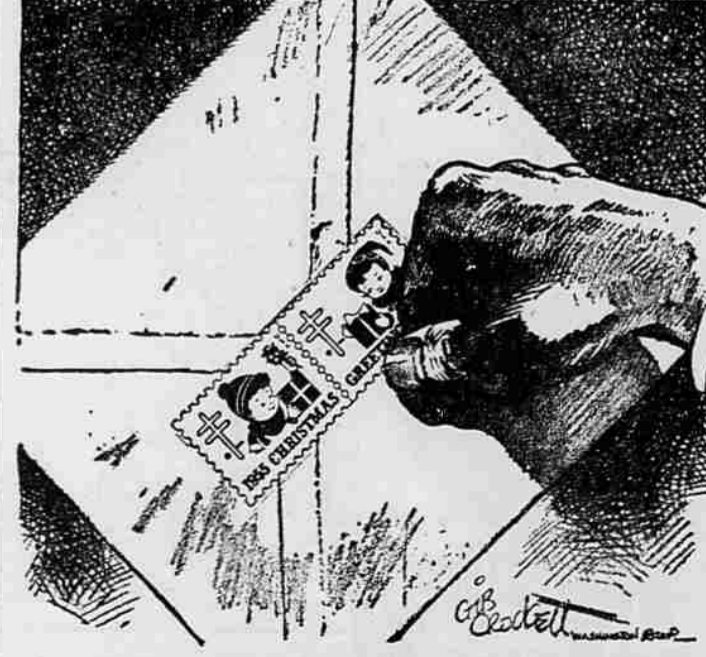
