**Scope Broadened**  
All those matters, and some 650 pages of other private and personal problems, are dealt with in the latest revised edition of Amy Vanderbilt's complete book of etiquette, published tomorrow by Doubleday.

As high society has ceased having such rigid rules of admittance and behavior, the social experts have broadened their scope to include manners for family occasions.

Under the heading, "The Agreeable Husband," Miss Vanderbilt writes that if a man must be grouchy before coffee in the morning, he should be sure the family understands that there is nothing personal about it. She also lists the following rules for agreeable husbands:

**Clean And Presentable**  
"The agreeable husband conducts himself at the table exactly as if guests were present. He is clean, combed and generally presentable. . . he should limit his smoking to the end of the meal using an ash tray instead of dishes as ash receptacles . . ."
