

### SHADY COVE New Drug Store Opens

Shady Cove-Trail — Approximately 500 persons attended the opening of the new Cove Drug store on Saturday, Nov. 26. Ice cream, coffee and donuts were served during the day.

Mr. and Mrs. E. P. Jones will operate the store. Their son, Owen Jones, operates the Rex-all store in Grants Pass. Owen Jones was at the store. For the present, however, he will remain in Grants Pass. He is married and the father of three children, is a graduate of North Dakota State college, a member of the Active club in Grants Pass, member of the American Legion and served in the Navy during World War II. Both Owen Jones and his father, E. P. Jones, are registered pharmacists and the new store will have a complete prescription department, veterinary line and fountain.

The modern pumice brick structure was built under the direction of George Scott of Shady Cove with a good deal of local labor and materials bought locally used. The Jones family came to Oregon from Minnesota three years ago and the decision of the older couple to settle in Shady Cove was made on the recommendation of several friends and a general liking for this area. ## Officers, Bond Issues Will Be Decided In 12 Districts In Jackson County Monday

Elections will be held Monday, Dec. 5, in eight Jackson county water districts, three rural fire districts and one sanitary district.

Bond issues will be on the ballot in the Grandview water district and South Bear Creek sanitary district. Residents in Medford rural fire district will vote on annexation of land in the Griffin Creek area.

In all the elections only one candidate has filed for each position. Voters, however, may vote for write-in candidates.

**Registered Voter**  
Those casting ballots in water and sanitary district elections must have been a registered voter for 30 days prior to the date of the election and reside within the boundary lines of the district in which they are voting.

Absentee voting is not allowed. Corporations owning property in rural fire districts may have one representative, who is a registered voter, cast a ballot for that corporation. Residents of the district who own taxable property and who are registered voters also may cast ballots. Voters should carry registration identification when going to the polls.

One commissioner will be elected for three years in Jacksonville Highway water district. Charles Hoppe, whose term expires Dec. 31, is a candidate for reelection. The polls at Oak Grove school will be open from 2 until 8 p.m.

Eddie Berteau, 2640 Howard ave., is candidate for commissioner in the Midway water district. A commissioner will be elected for five years to fill the expiring term of L. C. McKay. The polls at Howard school will open from 2:30 to 5:30 p.m.

**Seek Reelection**  
In the Grand View water district, two incumbent commissioners will be running for reelection. Mrs. Jacquise Moore, who was appointed to fill the vacancy of Mrs. Dorothy Brown, is a candidate for a five year term as commissioner. Floyd W. Fogelquist, Roberts rd., who was appointed to fill a vacancy left by William Auel, will be a candidate for a term ending Dec. 31, 1956.

Voters of the Grand View district also will be asked to approve a bond issue, not to exceed \$27,000, for additional water distribution and installation of fire hydrants.

The Grand View poll will be at the Earl Richardson residence, 2133 Crater Lake ave., and will be open between 8 a.m. and 8 p.m.

**Maple Park Election**  
Maple Park water district voters will elect two commissioners. John Klukkert, 1123 Bens lane, is a candidate for the term ending Dec. 31, 1958, left vacant by William Hughes. Edwin C. Rutter, incumbent commissioner, is seeking reelection to a five year term. The poll will be at 1242 Bens lane and will be open from 2 until 8 p.m.

Herman W. Newland, 1134 Morrow rd., is a candidate for a five year term as commissioner of the Kenwood water district. The expiring term was filled by Raymond Graves who moved from the district. Polls, at the Joseph Rush residence, 1579 Biddle rd., will be open from 2 to 8 p.m.

Elk City water district voters will elect one commissioner for three years. B. Sam Taylor, the incumbent, is candidate for reelection. The poll will be at the office of the Elk Lumber company, North Pacific highway, and will be open between 2 and 8 p.m.

**Gunter Candidate**  
In the Kings Highway water district, Claude L. Gunter, 1596 South Peach st., is candidate for commissioner to fill the expiring five year term of Edwin Bostwick. The Wayne Troxell residence, 1833 South Peach st., will be the polling place. Polls will be open from 2 until 8 p.m. Jack W. Bush is candidate for

reelection in the Charlotte Anne water district. One commissioner will be elected for five years. Polls at 3761 South Pacific highway will be open from 8 a.m. until 8 p.m.

In South Bear Creek sanitary district, Edward Stevens, South Pacific highway, is seeking reelection for three years. Polls will be located at the Dewey C. Gearin residence, 3578 South Pacific highway.

**Bond Issue**  
A request for permission to issue bonds not to exceed \$40,000 for additional funds for construction of trunk and lateral sewer lines will be submitted to voters of the South Bear Creek district.

Table Rock sanitary district and the Berrydale Sanitary district will not hold elections this year.

In Medford rural fire district, director Harper Hamilton, 2199 Crestbrook rd., is a candidate for reelection to a five year term.

**Annexation Proposal**  
Members of the district also will vote on annexation of property between Griffin Creek road and Griffin Creek. The property is bounded on the north by the Jacksonville - Phoenix highway and extends to the Poorman Creek road, including the Griffin Creek Grange hall and school house.

Polls, located at Oak Grove school will be open from 2 until 8 p.m.

Rogue River rural fire district voters will elect one director. Polls at Miller Realty office will remain open from 2 until 8 p.m.

Claude Hoover, Sticky lane, is candidate for reelection to a five year term as director in the Central Point rural fire district. Polls located at the rural fire station south of Central Point, will remain open between 2 and 8 p.m.

## Trio Works on Plan To Cut Western Oregon Rainfall For Use in Eastern Oregon

Corvallis — (U.P.) — Three Oregon State college meteorologists have come up with a plan which they believe would decrease rainfall along the coast in the winter and send it to eastern Oregon.

Fred Decker, Russell Lincoln and John Day said the Oregon coast range would provide an ideal site for a large-scale test aimed at suppressing coastal rainfall in the winter. It would be done by "treating" clouds, or overseeding them to reduce precipitation.

Their idea would be to provide so many tiny ice crystals high in the clouds that none would grow into large enough size to produce rain. The ice crystals might be introduced into the clouds by means of dry ice from planes or chemicals from ground generators. An experiment now is under way at Mt. Washington, N.H., to observe the role of over seeding clouds to cut down precipitation.
