Turncoat Prisoner Richard Tenneson Will Return Home

Hong Kong—(U.P.)—The British Embassy in Peiping has informed the U.S. government that turncoat war prisoner Richard R. Tenneson, 22, Alden, Minn., will be released by the Communist Chinese, it was disclosed today.

The message from Peiping said Tenneson would cross the border from Red China to Hong Kong today. He did not appear, but observers said he may show up tomorrow.

Tenneson was understood to have wanted to leave Red China ever since three other turncoat war prisoners returned last July. They were Cpl. William A. Cowart, Monticello, Ark.; Cpl. Otho G. Bell, Hillsboro, Miss., whose wife lived in Olympia, Wash.; and Cpl. Lewis W. Griggs, Jacksonville, Tex.

Tenneson was among a group of 23 American servicemen who refused repatriation in the prisoner exchange at the end of the Korean war.

Alden, Minn.—(U.P.)—"I'm so thankful, I don't know what to say," Mrs. Portia Howe said today when she learned her turncoat soldier son, Richard Tenneson, 22, will be coming home from Red China any day.

"The Lord has heard my prayers," Mrs. Howe said in a voice choked with emotion. "Seeing Richard again will be a terrific emotional thing for all of us."

Mrs. Howe flew to Japan in an effort to see her son and convince him to come home, but he refused to see her at that time.

Bonus Baby Rule Vote On Thursday

Columbus, Ohio—(U.P.)—The world champion Brooklyn Dodgers squared off today for a battle on "bonus babies" that could even equal their classic series scrap with the Yankees—and they figured to win this one, too.

There was a flurry of last-minute lobbying before Thursday's minor league voting on whether to keep the present bonus rule or to scrap it. If it is scrapped, there will be either no bonus restrictions at all or a proviso whereby the kids who are handed big dough for their signatures are made eligible for the unrestricted draft after one or two years of minor league play.

The Dodgers, who still have more minor league farm clubs than anybody else, were mustering their strength all the way from the Class D leagues up to the triple A minors.

The Yankees aren't committed on the bonus but is indicated they might even go along with the Dodgers and vote to support the present rule which requires that all kids who sign for more than \$4,000 must stick with that particular major league club for two years.

Detroit, a free spending outfit which has picked up some phenomenal bonus lads in the past, wants to be able to go out and scout the country and give whatever money it takes to acquire them.

"The present rule is un-American, unenforceable and as restrictive of our freedom as the old prohibition amendment," declared Spike Briggs, the Tiger owner.

Fresco Thompson of the Dodgers shot back that "this rule is just beginning to be effective because we've given it a chance to work."
