Improvements Asked by Stockmen

Four range improvement projects for Jackson county recommended for development by the county were approved last night by the range improvement committee of the Jackson County Stockman's association, it was announced yesterday by County Agent W. B. Tucker.

The recommendations were asked of the association by the county court, which has at its disposal funds derived through the Taylor Grazing act for improvement of county range land, Tucker said.

The committee recommended construction of two three-four mile drift fences, one in the Keene Creek-Dead Indian area and the other in the Green Springs-Hiatt reservoir area, and the construction of two cattle guards those areas.

Tucker said stockmen are invited to give suggestions for use of the Taylor Grazing funds, which amount to about \$1,200 annually.

Members of the committee are Henry Owens, Ashland; Ike Peile, Shady Cove; Clarence Straus, Sams Valley.

About 10 other recommendations will be submitted to the county court for approval and construction after June 30, 1956.

Ashland — Oregon State college has announced that T. G. Zinn Jr., Klamath Falls, will be one of four students to go abroad next summer as an International Farm Youth delegate, sponsored by the 4-H Club Foundation and the Federal extension service.

Zinn attended Southern Oregon college from 1951 to 1953. He was president of the junior class, business manager for the Raider yearbook, and also a representative to the Model United Nations.

Rebuilding of Grange In Applegate Planned

Applegate — The Upper Applegate Grange at its last meeting voted to build a new Grange hall to replace the old building destroyed by fire earlier this year.

The new building will be built on the same site as the old one, it was decided, and will be constructed of pumice or concrete block material. Plans for the building have been approved by the Grange and submitted to an architect for drafts and specifications.

It is hoped that construction can be started soon, Grange members said. Meanwhile, the organization will continue holding meetings at the Ruch school.
