

'Peace and Prosperity' To Be Battle Cry of Republicans Next Autumn

Washington—(U.P.)—Top Republicans agreed today that "peace and prosperity" will be their battle cry in next year's political campaign. Democrats threatened to drown this out with loud criticism of administration foreign policy.

House GOP leader Joseph W. Martin Jr., who conferred with President Eisenhower Saturday, told reporters the "peace and prosperity" issue would be pushed hard by Republicans next year.

Sen. Homer Capehart (R-Ind.) agreed. "Of course we're going to debate foreign policy," Capehart said. "But we must be factual about it. Peace and prosperity is a good factual theme."

Democratic National Chair-

man Paul M. Butler called on Mr. Eisenhower to rule out the "peace" campaign by Republicans.

Irishman Claims Long-Talking Record

Dartford, England—(U.P.)—A silver-tongued Irishman claims to have set a new world's record by talking 133 hours without a stop.

Kevin Sheehan, a former Irish Guards trooper, talked to crowds in a local dance hall on subjects ranging from sex to cricket.

Attended by a doctor, nurse and voice coach, Sheehan talked two hours longer than the previous record of 131 hours claimed by a Russian.

He promised an open attack on the Eisenhower-Dulles foreign policy if the GOP uses the peace theme.

Democratic members of the House Foreign Affairs committee also served notice they will criticize foreign policy. Reps. Omar Bursleson (D-Tex.) and Wayne L. Hays (D-O.) said nothing makes the administration immune from attack.

Mr. Eisenhower and Dulles have pleaded that the overseas program be kept out of politics. Dulles said both parties should at least refrain from "partisan excesses." Since that time, however, foreign policy has surged forward until not it is about on par with the farm situation as a topic for political debate.

Sen. Joseph C. O'Mahoney (D-Wyo.) said that in 1952 Republicans hurled "20 years of treason" charges at the Democrats. He implied that the GOP can expect retaliation next year.

Sen. Hubert H. Humphrey (D-Minn.) repeated the Republicans

should repent their 1952 attacks on former President Truman and his secretary of state, Dean Acheson, if they want to take foreign policy out of politics.

Martin said he is confident the GOP will win in 1956, even without Mr. Eisenhower on the ticket.

He said he fully realizes, and so does Mr. Eisenhower, that the Republicans must come up next year with legislation to "help the small farmer." This is the GOP's "biggest problem" he said.

New York's Gov. Averell Harriman, a potential Democratic presidential candidate, told Oklahoma Democrats that "there is no such thing as peaceful co-existence" with Russia.

"That is a Russian proposal and it would be a mistake for us to swallow it," Harriman said. "They don't want war. They are not foolish. A world war would destroy Russia. But they want to maintain a strong position against us."
