There Are Psychological As Well As Physical Shocks

It is recognized by most people that a bad injury or severe illness may affect a person so he doesn't behave normally. Emotional shock has the same effect. (Q) "I wish you could help me understand the change that has come over my wife. She is 35 years old, the mother of two fine children. We have always been very happy. During the summer, while we were away on vacation, we received word that her mother had died of a heart attack. My wife was devoted to her mother and this was a terrible shock to her. She had no idea her mother had died."

"Since then, my wife has been a changed woman. She seems to have lost interest in the children, home, her appearance, and even in me. She doesn't cry or show grief but seems listless. She never smiles or laughs as she used to, and doesn't talk unless someone asks her a question. She no longer goes out with friends but sits around the house

doing nothing.

"I am worried she will lose her mind if this keeps up. I have talked to our doctor about her and he says she is suffering from 'bereavement shock.' Is this likely to continue much longer?"—H. B.

(A) A bad emotional shock is often harder to recover from than a bad physical shock. If your wife had received a serious operation that was a shock to her whole nervous system, you could not expect her to get over the effects for a year or more. It may take that long or longer for her to get over the shock of her mother's death.

However, she will not get over it by brooding. Unquestionably, she is blaming herself for having been away when her mother died and this self-reproach is intensifying her emotional state. If she could be persuaded to give vent to her grief, by crying or talking about it, she would get over it sooner. As it is, she bottles up her emotional states, causing her to behave as if life were meaningless to her.

If your doctor cannot help, I suggest you ask him to recommend a psychiatrist.

Sub-Zero Cold Grips Northlands

Sub-zero cold gripped the nation's north today and a new Pacific storm doused the West Coast with rain and snow.

Temperatures fell steadily in the northern Midwest following a week end blizzard. In Wisconsin early today it was icy 15 below at both Grantsburg and Wausau and 12 below at Eau Claire.

It was even colder in the central Rockies, where Fraser, Colo., became the nation's icebox with 16 degrees below zero. Winds of 35 miles per hour, with gusts up to 52 mph, brought added shivers to Southeast Wyoming.

On the West Coast, more rains were expected in the wake of a Pacific storm which spread rain from Central California into the Pacific Northwest and dumped moderate to heavy snows on the mountain areas.

The rains caused some power failures yesterday and forced a work stoppage on the Isals creek railroad bridge in San Francisco, delaying movement of some Southern Pacific commuter trains as much as 90 minutes.

Texas reported up to 3 1/2 inches of fast-melting snow in the Amarillo area and cold weather also spread over all of the nation's eastern third, sparing only Maine and Florida. Syracuse, N.Y., got two inches of snow in a 24-hour period and one inch was measured at Erie, Pa.

Threatened Spokane Bus Strike Averted

Spokane — (U.P.) — A threatened bus strike here was averted late yesterday when representatives of Spokane city lines and the AFL bus drivers union reached agreement on a new contract.

The agreement is subject to a vote of the union membership but the union negotiators agreed to recommend that it be accepted.

Under terms of the agreement, the drivers will get a two cent hourly wage boost retroactive to April 1 and another 10 cents an hour Jan. 1. Retiring drivers will get an additional \$5 a month pension.
