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Postal Department Adviser Obligated

Washington (U.P.) — Jack Howard, president of the E. W. Scripps Co. and general editorial manager of the Scripps-Howard newspapers, was sworn in today as a new member of the Post Office Department's advisory board.

Howard, 45, named to the post by President Eisenhower, was sworn in by Postmaster General Arthur E. Summerfield in Summerfield's office.

The seven-member advisory board consists with Summerfield on ways to improve postal service.

Howard, a Yale University graduate and Navy veteran of World War II, succeeds Mrs. Consuelo N. Bailey, who resigned after her election as lieutenant governor of Vermont.

Nine Ships Idled In West Coast Ports

San Francisco (U.P.) — The number of ships idled in West Coast ports by a strike of AFL Marine Firemen rose today to nine.

Five of the ships were tied up in San Francisco and four in Los Angeles. It appeared likely that a number of other ships would be hit today elsewhere along the coast.

The firemen said they will refuse to work until they get the same vacation pay as that recently granted to AFL Sailors and Marine Cooks under a new master contract covering 6,000 maritime workers.

If the firemen carry out their threat, as many as 150 ships operated by member firms of the Pacific Maritime Association will be affected.

A 17-year-old Medford boy was fined \$30 in district court, Tuesday, on a charge of illegal possession of alcoholic beverages.

A charge of assault and battery against Alonzo Everett Alexander and Opal Mae Alexander, 335 Front st., was dismissed by District Court Judge Rawles Moore because the complaining witness failed to appear.

Parents Urged To Get Salk Shots For Children Soon

Washington (U.P.) — Surgeon General Leonard A. Scheele appealed to parents today to get Salk shots for their children as soon as possible to be sure they are protected during the 1956 polio season.

If everyone waits until May, he warned, there will be a "hopeless logjam." Inevitably, he said, some children would miss out at least temporarily.

Scheele made the plea after a committee of the nation's leading polio authorities unanimously rejected a proposed switch to a single-shot inoculation program to stretch Salk supplies to more children.

The experts, including Dr. Jonas E. Salk, met all day Wednesday on the question. Scheele announced they agreed to stick to the present schedule which calls for three injections over an eight-month period.

The surgeon general said the scientists decided there wasn't enough evidence to be sure one shot would suffice over a long period. Salk called the decision "splendid." He said it means he will be able to give "the best protection to the most susceptible children." This is the best way to cut down on polio incidence, Salk said.

Scheele reported that the experts decided against the single-shot program because "it might dilute the effect" of the vaccine on polio prevention.

Basil O'Connor, president of the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis, said the experts made "a very sound decision to continue the program as it is presently operating."
