

Eagle Point Winner Over Jacksonville

Eagle Point — Eagle Point high cagers will try to make it two straight over the Jacksonville Redskins tonight when the clubs clash at Jacksonville.

The Eagles bounced the Redskins 47 to 31 here last night. In taking the decision Eagle Point never trailed in the evening. The home club went on to stay in the early moments and headed 8 to 4, 21 to 11 and 33 to 21.

The Redskins broke up the Eagle passing attack with some good ballhawking particularly in the early stages of the tussle and would have made a closer game of it had they had some sharper shooting. But the Eagles, for their part, yielded few close in shots and gave Jacksonville few good tries until the final portion of the game when the lead was too wide to overcome. And the Eagle Pointers were able to work the ball in for a number of good opportunities at fairly short range.

Gary Foran, whose favorite firing spot was from the side at about 10-foot range, was the only scorer in double figures with 12.

Eagle Point lead was squeezed to 8 to 6 at the opening of the second quarter but the home quint established control by working to a couple of 12-point margins before halftime. The spread was 13 points three times in the third quarter and the widest gap was 20 points at 41 to 21 in the final panel.

WIL Official Halts Rumor

"It's news to us," Fleishman told the United Press in response to a query from the Mail Tribune. Fleishman said something may develop along those lines at a league meeting in Yakima Sunday but so far his office has received no hint that the league's largest city would quit.

WOULD STOP MEDFORD. Such action by any of the seven teams in the league would automatically eliminate Medford's possibility of gaining a berth this year, it was pointed out here. Medford was invited to make it an eight-team league. If one team dropped out and Medford came in, the circuit would again be a seven-team organization, which is not satisfactory to sound operation, it was pointed out.

Response to a partnership plan to finance operation of a Medford entry was meeting with "very limited" acceptance today, but the backers had hopes that sufficient interest would be shown in the next couple of days to assure Medford's entry.
