Funeral Services For W. F. Brittan Will Be Saturday

Funeral services for Walter Fawcett Brittan, 72, Table Rock estates, who died Thursday, will be held at 10:30 a.m. tomorrow, at Perl's Funeral home.

Mr. Brittan was born in Beloit, Wis., April 21, 1883, the son of Charles Hughes and Jessie L. Fawcett Brittan. He spent most of his childhood in Chicago. He was married to Madeleine Suzanne Richard in 1933.

Active in Business
He was active in both grain and oil interest during his business career, and in later years was closely identified with the Republican party. Mr. Brittan served as assistant to Colby M. Chester, who was chairman of the Republican finance committee during the 1944 campaign.

Mr. Brittan was a staff member of the American Petroleum institute of New York, where he was a specialist in taxation. Later he served as assistant to John W. Hanes, president of the Citizens National committee of New York. Hanes formerly was under secretary of the United States treasury.

Lived at Estates
Mr. Brittan with his wife built an outstanding residence at the Table Rock estates near Gold Hill, and lived there since July, 1950.

He is survived by his wife, Madeleine, and a daughter, Sonia, of San Francisco, Calif. Pall bearers will be Tom Hight, Col. A. D. Harvey, Warren Lesseg, Robert Wells, George Harrington and Thomas Monahan.

The family has requested that flowers be omitted.

In other action, the council asked for estimates on grading and improving the east end of Fifth ave., heard a report that the Gold Hill Lions club planned to install bicycle racks in the downtown business area, and instructed that information be obtained from the highway department regarding possible relocation of the Sams Valley highway in Gold Hill.
