DIZZINESS AND EAR NOISES

Hundreds of men and women, usually past middle age, ask me what to do for dizziness and ear noises. Most of them say they have had much treatment for a year or more, and still they are no better. Many have been told that they have Meniere's disease, but a little inquiry shows that they probably haven't had it. More probably they have had a plugging-up of a little artery in the brain.

Loss of Security

Evidently, then, it was a little part of the brain that was injured, and a test, even with a ticking watch, shows that nothing happened to the ears; they are all right. A question will show, also, that the person hasn't the sort of vertigo or dizziness that comes with an injury to the ear. Neither the room nor the man seems to be spinning around. What troubles him is a loss of security in the sense of balance. He will say, "I feel as if I might fall down, but I never

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MOO-O-O-S AND MUSINGS

We haven't any really good treatment for Meniere's disease. Fortunately, in many cases, after months the spells stop coming. Doctor's usually try a salt-poor diet, nicotinic acid, which for a few minutes causes an increased flow of blood to the head; and histamine, the mode of action of which is not clear.

In rare cases in which the disease becomes unbearable, the inner ear is destroyed surgically but this, of course, will produce complete deafness on the one side. Fortunately, Meniere's syndrome is almost always due to disease in only one ear.

As I said, persons well past middle age usually tell a different story and they haven't Meniere's disease. On being questioned carefully, they may remember that their trouble started one day when they had a very frightening dizzy spell when, perhaps, they thought they were having a stroke and were going to die. Or they woke in the night or in the morning, very dizzy. Actually, in these cases,

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do. I feel sort of woozy and uncertain and at times confused."

Then, if I talk to the man's wife, I may learn that with his little stroke he changed a bit: He became older, somewhat slowed-up, more irritable and quick-tempered, more emotional (sometimes at home he cried) and at the office he was less able to get along with people and to get his work done.

Naturally, there are many milder cases in which the diagnosis is difficult, but still, a good ear specialist will say in a minute: "This is not true Meniere's disease arising in an ear."

High Blood Pressure
Thousands of elderly persons who complain of an uncertain

sense of balance together with ear noises have a high blood pressure, which may well have something to do with the dizziness in the head. In their case, some lowering of the pressure, perhaps with a rauwolfia drug, may bring some comfort. When there has been a tiny stroke there may be little that can be accomplished with treatment because a bit of tissue has been destroyed and it cannot be built back. Many persons have to settle down to get used to their ear noises and their uncertain sense of balance. If I had such troubles

I doubt if I would take any medicine or attempt any treatment. I certainly would not spend money traveling about the country in search of relief.
