

Cotton Farmers Vote on Market Quotas for 1956

Washington — U.P. — Cotton farmers in 21 states voted today on whether to accept marketing quotas on the 1956 cotton crop. An Agriculture Department official expected them to vote heavily for quotas.

About 1,300,000 farmers were eligible to cast ballots in the referendum.

The referendum was ordered by Secretary of Agriculture Ezra T. Benson when he set the national quota at 10,000,000 bales based on a national acreage of 17,391,304 acres. The 10,000,000 bale quota is the legal minimum which can be set.

Two-Thirds Vote Required
In a similar referendum last year, about 350,000 votes were cast, 92 per cent in favor of quotas. In 1954, almost 490,000 farmers approved quotas by a margin of 94 per cent.

At least two-thirds of the growers voting must approve quotas if they are to be continued in effect.

If the producers approve quotas, marketing quotas will be in effect on all farms growing cotton. Penalties will apply on excess cotton, acreage allotments will be in effect and price supports will be available at the full level of support to growers who comply with acreage allotments.

The support rate will be between 75 and 90 per cent of parity. The exact rate has not been set. The 1955 rate was 90 per cent. The 1956 rate, because of the huge surplus of the fiber, is expected to be somewhat under 90 per cent.

Extra Long Staple
If the producers disapprove quotas there will be no marketing quotas for the 1956 crop, acreage allotments will continue

in effect and price supports to eligible growers will be available at 50 per cent of parity.

Farmers in six states—Arizona, California, Florida, New Mexico, Georgia and Texas—also voted today on a 1956 marketing quota of 35,300 bales of extra long staple, or American-Egyptian cotton, to be grown on 45,305 acres.

The producers of upland cotton, the common type of fiber, voted in Alabama, Arizona, Arkansas, California, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Kansas, Ken-

tucky, Louisiana, Maryland, Mississippi, Missouri, Nevada, New Mexico, North Carolina, Oklahoma, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas and Virginia.

Spiritualism Sect Plans To Build Home

Newark, N. Y. — U.P. — A replica of the famed Fox cottage, home of modern spiritualism which was destroyed by fire recently, will be built at the birth-site of the sect on the Hydesville Road just northwest of this northern New York community.

Mrs. Margaret Lewis, president and founder of the Ministry of Spiritual and Divine Sciences at Hydesville, announced plans for the building project on the exact site which is marked by a stone edifice. She said the replica of the cottage, which was moved to Lily Dale, N.Y., in 1916, will contain furnishings of that period. The cottage also will house many relics owned by the Fox sisters, Katie and Margaret.

A memorial shrine park is under construction on a triangular three-acre plot at the birthplace site.

The Fox cottage was destroyed by fire of undetermined origin on Sept. 21.

lieve elbow soreness. The note from Mrs. Eisenhower said: "Your gift has been one of the most welcome he has received because it has afforded him so much pleasure and relaxation."

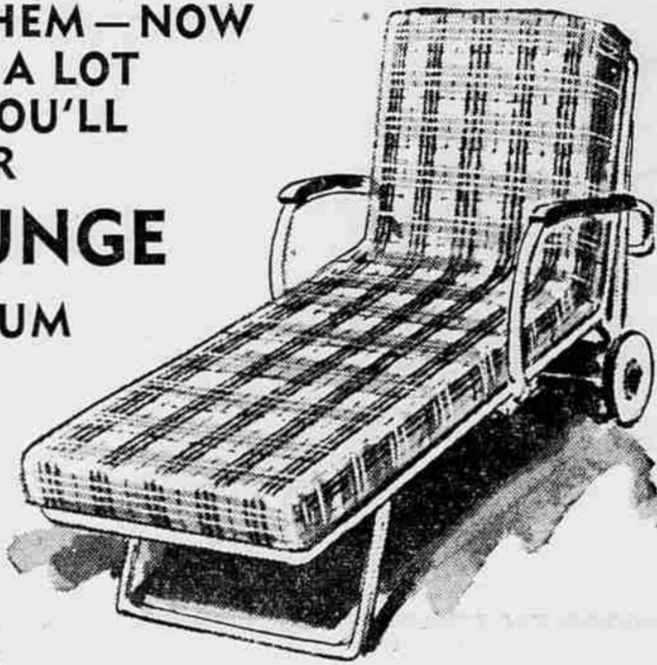

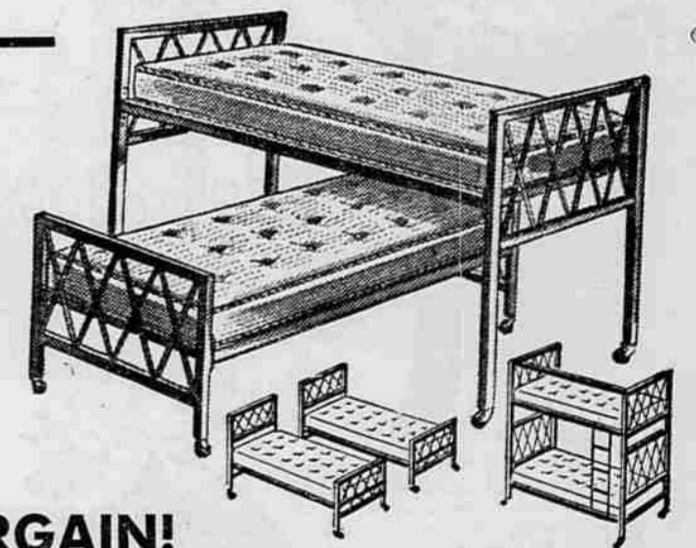
