

Surplus Wheat, Corn Made Available To Foreign Countries

Washington — (U.P.) — Secretary of Agriculture Ezra T. Benson announced today that U.S. surplus wheat and corn will be made available immediately to charitable agencies for distribution to the hungry overseas.

Stocks of dried beans and rice also will be released for foreign relief.

The action was a major victory for Protestant, Catholic, and Jewish leaders who had appealed jointly to Benson for release of surplus grains for overseas relief.

Law Interpretation Hit

The religious leaders made the appeal in a meeting with Benson last month. They argued that the Agriculture Department had placed too narrow an interpretation on a law enacted by Congress last year. It authorizes free allocations of surplus farm products to voluntary relief agencies for distribution to the needy abroad.

Previously, the department had released only farm products which were in danger of spoiling in storage, mainly dairy products and cottonseed oil. And it had served notice that the availability of dairy products for relief agencies would be sharply curtailed next year because surplus stocks were dwindling.

From Government Stocks

The foods will come from the government's stock of more than \$7,700,000,000 worth of surplus farm products.

City Planners Call Hearings on Zone Change Requests

The planning commission called for two public hearings on zone change requests at its meeting last night.

One hearing is in the recently annexed Laurelhurst addition, where the commission recommended that the area west of Mary st. and north to the north city limits be rezoned to class 3B commercial to conform with businesses already established. The remainder of the area would be rezoned to class 1B two-family residential. The area was annexed as single family residential.

The other hearing is on change of zone request from the First Church of Christ, Scientist, for property recently annexed in Siskiyou Heights extension at Woodlawn and Richmond aves. Both hearings will be held at the Jan. 9 meeting.

The commission recommended to the council that property owned by Marrs R. Gibbons at McAndrews rd. and Clark st. be changed from two-family residential to heavy industrial.

Commission members pointed out during a public hearing that property just to the east is heavy industrial. Several residents appeared objecting to the change, saying property values would decrease.

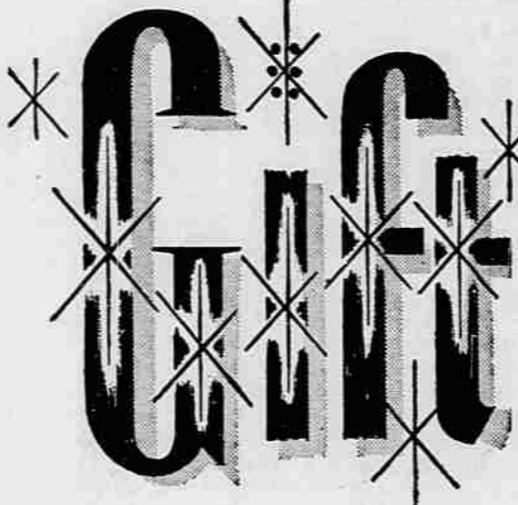
The commission voted against amending existing zoning ordinances to include trailer courts in commercial zones and recommending a request that lots on Boardman st. be rezoned to light industrial, on the basis of spot zoning, be denied.

Portlander Arraigned On Narcotics Charges

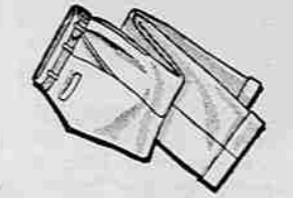

Chin Hing Fun, alias Bill Chin, was arrested here last night by U. S. narcotics agent Jack Merrill.

Also arrested was Imogene Terry Lewis, 34, wife of a San Diego, Calif., sailor recently convicted by the Navy for smuggling narcotics into this country from Mexico. Merrill said there was no connection between the raid and the Navy court-martial. Merrill said more than \$1,000 worth of heroin was found in Fun's apartment, along with a small quantity of opium and goods apparently stolen by drug addicts.
