He put the merits of plastic grocery bags this way: "The housewife could carry home her groceries in a bag that not only would withstand the ride home from the supermarket but could be re-used many times as a refrigerator bag, a sweater bag, a garbage can liner, a general storage bag, a traveling bag, a bathing suit bag, and for one of a number of varied uses polyethylene has around the home."

Gettysburg, Pa.—(U.P.)—Backstairs at the Gettysburg White House:

It seems wise to some of the people around Mr. Eisenhower, irritating to others, that newsmen continue to report the chief executive's changeable physical appearance, during his convalescence.

Actually, this practice is a good indicator of how Mr. Eisenhower is feeling, not only physically, but emotionally, too.

When he shows up for work at his postoffice quarters here looking glum and paying no attention to the people who wave to him, chances are that he is faced with a pressing problem or just plain feels tired.

And at this stage of his recuperation, when he is tired it is a matter of national and even worldwide importance.

Mr. Eisenhower can look drawn and almost unhappy one day, and the next morning he is smiling picture of radiant good cheer and mending health.

The Republican leaders who saw him last Monday said the President was looking fine and they were not spreading political propaganda. His color was excellent and his facial expression indicated a sense of relaxation, although he put in one of his hardest work schedules that

Thornton Rules on Unemployment Pay

Salem—(U.P.)—Unemployment compensation cannot be paid to individuals receiving payments under a retirement plan sponsored or participated in by an employer, under an amendment agreed to by the 1955 Legislature and taking effect last Aug. 3, Attorney General Robert Y. Thornton ruled yesterday.

The question arose as to the definition of an "employer." Thornton held that the federal government is not an "employer" within the meaning of the unemployment act.

Therefore, individuals drawing retirement pay under a plan participated in by the federal government are not subject to the amendment and may draw compensation for weeks of unemployment—if otherwise eligible.
