Malmoe, Sweden.—(U.P.)—Two American Marines were found guilty Thursday of slugging a priest of Swedish policemen in a street brawl but both escaped jail.

The Medical Roundup

NEED FOR TALKING TO PATIENTS
Today, many of us internists pride ourselves on our great scientific skill and our rule in the office that no patient is to be seen by us until all tests known to medicine have been made on him. I know of cases in which persons who very much wanted only to ask the physician a few questions had first to get all the tests made and then they had to come into the consulting office as naked as they were the day they were born.

There is a story to the effect that a senior warden of a church once had to go through this procedure in order to get from a prominent physician a contribution to the fund for a new organ! From true stories that scores of my patients have told me, I am sure the one about the senior warden is not beyond belief.

Many a patient who comes to me wants mainly an interpretation, which he can understand, of findings, perhaps apparently conflicting, reported by a doctor after a thorough overhauling. Often I can show that apparent conflicts in opinion were not really conflicts. For instance, the "spastic colon" diagnosed by one man was the same as the "mucous colitis" of another; the "nervous stomach" of another, or the "ptosis" of another. All these words, when translated, meant that the doctor had not found anything wrong with the patient. Why didn't he say that? Because if he had, the patient might have gone away offended.

What Report Means
In my recent years of more-or-less retirement from practice, I take pleasure in explaining to puzzled persons what their long-winded report from some clinic means. To illustrate: The other day a man came in wheezing with an old asthma. One clinic doctor had told him he had emphysema, another that he had polyps in his nose, and another that he had a chronic bronchitis. Another said he had an overburdened right heart; another gave him a prescription and dismissed him. Unfortunately, the poor fellow was terribly puzzled. He did not know if he had five separate diseases, or one disease; and he did not know what to do, or what the future offered

undreds of the tiny air sacs had broken and formed larger and less efficient cavities; that these changes could never be repaired by any drug; that the increased resistance to the circulation in the lung had put a burden on the right side of the heart that could not be lessened; that a chronic bronchitis was part of the process in the lung, and the polyps in the nose were due to mucus constantly running out from diseased sinuses. The polyps could easily be removed and that would make for easier breathing.

Israel-Syria Trouble

Background of the troubles between Israel and Syria: Palestine was partitioned into Jewish and Arab states in 1947 and the state of Israel was proclaimed May 15, 1948. The Arab states refused to accept the new nation and went to war against Israel.
In the course of the fighting, Israel took over more territory than had been allotted to it by the partition.
To stop the bloodshed, the United Nations negotiated a series of cease-fire agreements between Israel and her Arab neighbors. Syria was the last to leave Israeli legions to leave Israeli soil. The armistice was signed July 20, 1949.
Despite the agreement sporadic fighting continued between the two countries, mostly confined to border clashes.

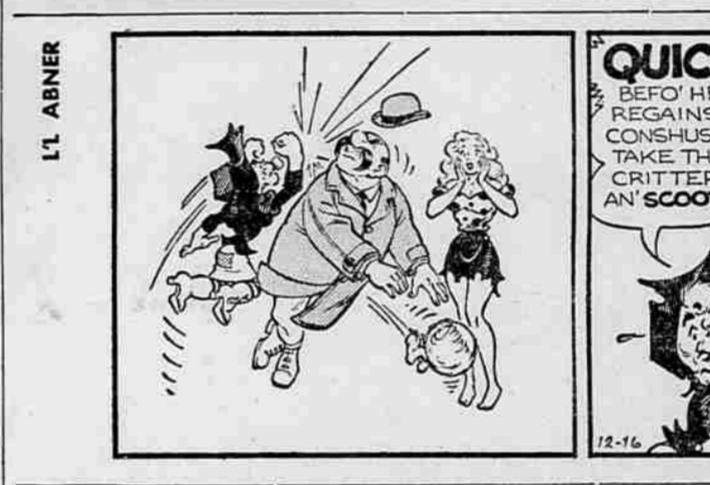
FOREIGN MINISTER FREED
