Christmas Shopping Buyers Set Record

Washington—(U.P.)—The nation's shoppers set a record in Christmas buying last week.

Department store sales for the week ending last Saturday were 6 per cent higher than the old record a year ago, the Federal Reserve Board reported yesterday.

The board gave 1.0 dollars and cents figures but said its sales index for last week—normally the peak of the Christmas rush—stood at 255 per cent of the 1947-49 base period. This was 15 points higher than the same week in 1954 and 21 points above that week in 1953.

Christmas buying pushed total department store sales so far this year 7 per cent above the total for the same period of 1954.

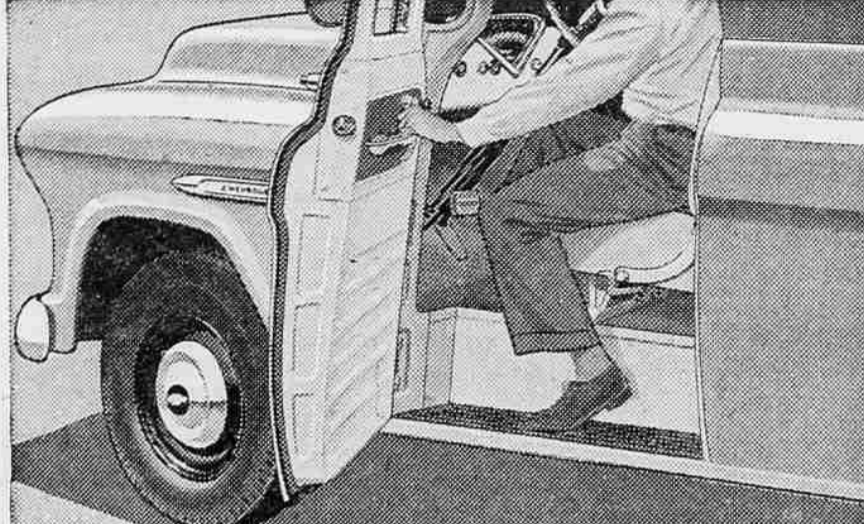

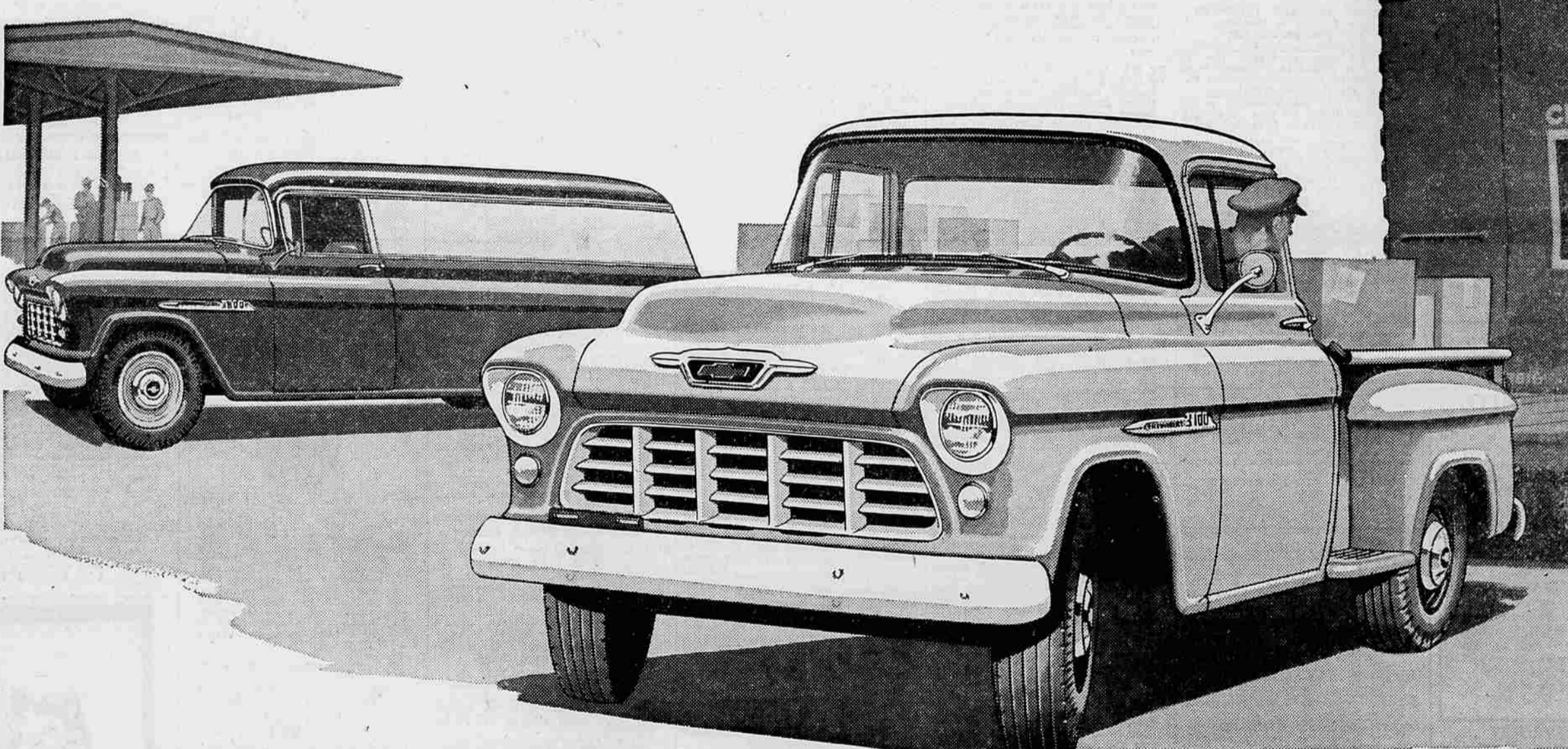
The registered voters in said contiguous territory are hereby invited to vote and cast their ballots on such annexation at said election.
