Heart Attacks Common In Negro Men and Women

In the Nov. 21 number of Medical News is an interesting report showing that in Chicago the death rate from coronary heart disease (per 100,000 population) in Negro men aged from 45 to 64 years was 831. The similar figure for white men was 771. This certainly does not support the idea that the commonest cause of heart attacks is the strain of life in big business.

Another strange observation made by Dr. Jeremiah Stamler, as he studied the mortality figures obtained from Dr. Bunde-son and Dr. William Fishbein, was that among whites with heart attacks there were five deaths in men to one in women (in the 25 to 44 year group). In the 45 to 64 year group the ratio dropped to 2.5 men and one woman.

Among Negroes in the 25 to 44 year group the ratio was almost one to one. It will be correlated with their often great obesity, or perhaps with a large amount of the fat-like cholesterol in their blood, or perhaps within their blood a large number of the large cholesterol-containing molecules described by Dr. John Gofman of the University of California.

The Iron Lung Substitute

It looks as if the cumbersome and inconvenient iron lung will soon be scrapped and replaced by a much lighter apparatus which will enable the patient to sit up and get about in a hospital or home. At the recent meeting of the American Society of Anesthesiologists a device was described which fits over the patient's neck and regularly sends a wave of air into his lungs through a hole made in his trachea, just below the Adam's apple. The trachea is the tube that carries air to and from the lungs.

Dr. Frederick H. Van Bergen, of the University of Minnesota, reported after seven months' study of the new apparatus that it does a good job of supplying air to the lungs. It may be available commercially in another six months.

The Child Who Has Seizures

A while ago, Dr. Hadow M. Keith and his associates in the Children's Department at the Mayo Clinic studied the mental status of 296 children who had either petit mal (transient mild spells), grand mal (convulsions) or fainting spells or mixtures of petit mal and grand mal. The doctors found that 37.5 per cent of the children were mentally retarded, 14.5 per cent were dull, and 48 per cent had average or better than average intelligence.

Retardation was found most often in the youngest children, hence the earlier the spells appear the worse it is likely to be for the child. Retardation is much more likely to appear also in children who suffer from a large head, paralysis of one side of the body, spastic palsy, or other sign of local disease of the brain.

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Machine Duplicates Mineral Creation

Los Angeles — (U.P.) — Scientists can now complete in a relatively short period of time a task that Mother Earth devotes thousands of years to finishing.

Dr. David Griggs, Dr. George Kennedy and Dr. W. S. Fyfe, all of the Institute of Geophysics here, have developed a machine called the "Simple Squeezer" which can duplicate the methods used by the earth to create minerals.

The gimmick is made up, in part, of a hydraulic auto jack, a combustion tube furnace and several "home-grown" extra parts.

It is not unusual for the "Squeezer" to produce temperatures as high as 1,800 degrees Fahrenheit, and up to 1,500,000 pounds of pressure per square inch.

The experimenters place only one-tenth thousandth of an ounce of a powdered chemical compound between two pistons faces and then turn on their brain-child.

French Troops Alerted For Algeria Uprisings

Algiers, Algeria — (U.P.) — French troops remained on the alert today against possible Yuletide uprisings in rebel-ridden Algeria, but early indications were that the holidays would be relatively quiet.

Reports received in Algiers said 14 persons had been killed in isolated acts of violence but that threats of large-scale demonstrations against the French did not materialize. The toll was far less than expected.
