Radio Appeal Helps Capture Abductor

Milwaukee, Wis. — (U.P.) — A man brandishing a bloody butcher knife, held a three-month-old baby captive for almost six hours last night while a Catholic priest broadcast repeated appeals that he give himself up.

Ysias Sanchez, 26, was finally captured late last night in the home of a friend. The baby was found unharmed in the house and was returned to the mother. Police said Sanchez, a suspected narcotics addict, seized the child because he claimed to be

the father. He knifed Sepharino Garcia, husband of the mother, and pushed another man through a plate glass window during his flight with the baby.

Apartment Building
The abduction occurred at the apartment building where both Sanchez and the Garcias lived. Franciscan Father Gerald of Our Lady of Guadalupe Catholic church aided the police man-hunt by broadcasting repeated appeals in Spanish over radio station WOKY.

He begged Sanchez to return the infant to Mrs. Garcia or bring the child to his church. He also asked members of Milwaukee's large Mexican colony to report any news of Sanchez' whereabouts.
Almost six hours after the abduction, police came upon Sanchez. They had tracked him down through information given by Mrs. Garcia.

Woman Nominated Mother of the Year

Portland — (U.P.) — Mrs. Bertha Holt of Creswell, Ore., today was proposed as American Mother of the Year by Sen. Richard L. Neuberger (D-Ore.).

The senator said he had sent his nomination to the Mothers' committee of the Golden Rule Foundation in New York to obtain recognition for Mrs. Holt's "outstanding service to children and humanity and for deeds symbolizing the true meaning of Christmas."

Mrs. Holt and her husband recently adopted eight Korean war orphans and are supporting 30 more in orphanages in Korea. They have six children of their own.

Neuberger said "I believe that proper recognition of mothers who look upon the needs of humanity everywhere could be advanced by the nomination of Mrs. Bertha Holt as the American Mother of the Year for 1956."

Operation On Adlai's Son Said Successful

Chicago — (U.P.) — Doctors said today that an operation on the youngest son of Adlai E. Stevenson, injured in a car crash which killed two other youths, was a success.

John Fell Stevenson, 19, underwent a two-hour operation for removal of a shattered kneecap yesterday.

A Passavant Hospital spokesman said afterwards that the youth would suffer no crippling effects, but will probably remain hospitalized for 10 to 14 days before starting physical therapy.

Young Stevenson's car crashed last Wednesday with a truck near Goshen, Ind. Two Harvard University classmates were killed instantly and a third was injured.

Freeze Funds To See If Profits Legal

Buenos Aires — (U.P.) — Funds of 360 individuals and 97 companies, including two affiliated with U.S. firms, were frozen today and will remain so until they prove their profits were legal under the regime of ousted Dictator Juan D. Peron.

Two of the firms involved are industrialists Kaiser Argentina, a \$30,000,000 affiliate of the Henry J. Kaiser enterprises in the United States, and the Williams Chemical Co.

A total of 172 firms now are under investigation for possible illicit profits from 1943 until the downfall of Peron in the revolution last Sept. 20 in Argentina.

The list of individuals whose funds have been attached includes figures in the world of sports, the theater and virtually all collaborators of the Peron regime.

Among them are Juan Manuel Fangio, world champion auto racer, whose interests extend into the business field, internationally known tennis star Teran de Weiss, actress Fanny Navarro and Austrian industrialist Fritz Mandl.

West Germans To Get Some Tax Free Items

Bonn, Germany — (U.P.) — The West German government faced the facts today. It gave legal recognition to a booming black-market business conducted by Allied servicemen and Germans for nearly 11 years.

Hereafter Germans may accept specified amounts of tax-free cigarettes, tobacco, coffee, tea and liquor from friends or employees without paying customs duty—which the government never could collect anyway.

The announcement Monday thus "legalized" the wages or bonuses of hundreds of thousands of house maids, handymen, mechanics and salesmen. Since the occupation, American, British, and French troops have been paying all or part of their help with commodities they get tax free but for which the Germans must pay high duty.
