Morse Wants Atomic Plant at Hanford Peddicord Appears Before Grand Jury

Washington — (U.P.) — Senator Wayne Morse (D-Ore.) proposed today that the government build a large-scale atomic power plant at Hanford, Wash. He said he will ask Congress to direct the Atomic Energy Commission to "proceed immediately with a study leading to quick construction" of such a plant. He said it could be built in three or four years. Morse said the plant could convert to electric power "tremendous quantities of waste heat" now poured into the Columbia river from the AEC's plutonium works at Hanford.

Portland — (U.P.) — Blind William Clarence Peddicord, 38-year-old admitted bomber of the Meier and Frank department store last April, went before the grand jury investigating the case yesterday. Peddicord signed a waiver of immunity which allows use against him of any of his testimony. Peddicord implicated his sister-in-law, Joyce Keller, 28, who has maintained her innocence. The grand jury was expected to reach a decision on indictments soon, possibly today. The question of which attorney would represent Peddicord apparently was settled last night when the blind man an-

nounced it would be Nicholas Granet instead of Jim Hafey. Peddicord had indicated this earlier but then changed his mind. Granet indicated that arrangements are being made for a psychiatric examination for Peddicord. Portland — (U.P.) — Oregon labor leaders agreed yesterday to set up a negotiating committee to meet Jan. 17 to start the job of working out details of the merger of the AFL and CIO in the state. The merger generally was expected to follow along same lines as that of the two labor groups in New York earlier this month.

Slide, High Water Keeps Family Marooned Overnight

Hornbrook—Many stories are coming out of the recent flood situation. One of the most dramatic concerns one named locally "Operation Rescue," in which Lauran Paine and Paul Visser played leading roles. Robert Wilson, an employee of California Oregon Power company, was returned from Yreka with his mother, who was recuperating from a recent heart attack, to the Wilson home for the Christmas holiday. Accompanying him were his wife and their 3-year-old daughter and two sons, aged 6 and 13. Slide Blocks Road

After passing the Paine ranch on the Klamath river, a slide blocked the road. Because the road was narrow it was impossible to turn the car around. Leaving his family in the car, Wilson went to Paine's where he phoned Cope to send a truck to try to rescue his family. The truck started out at once, but the Jamie creek bridge was washed out, and was unable to proceed. By 2 a.m. no help had arrived and Wilson returned to Paine's. The Siskiyou county sheriff's office in Yreka was called for assistance. But help could not be obtained because Highway 99 was under water. Paine then called Hornbrook Constable Everett Elmoro who started out on his tractor, but he, too, was halted at the Prolsman's.

Borrowed Truck Visser then hiked through rain and the mud to the Tull ranch where he borrowed a pickup truck and drove to Paine's ranch. Paine and Wilson then started out with food and hot coffee for the Wilson family huddled together in raincoats and seeking shelter against an embankment. Shortly after dawn, a truck loaded to the sheriff by the National Guard got through to the Wilson family. With the help of the truck crew, Paine, Visser, and Wilson succeeded in carrying Wilson's mother on a stretcher several miles to the truck which returned her to Yreka. The trip made with the stretcher required three hours. The Wilson family was exposed from 5 p.m. Wednesday to about 10 a.m. Thursday. But at last report the family suffered no ill effects from their experience. Mention should be made of the vigilance of the men's wives, Esther Paine and Margot Visser, who had hot soup and coffee, and dry clothes ready, for the Wilsons.
