## Reichow Sparks Eastern Team

San Francisco —(U.P.)—Garet (Gerry) Reichow, a workhorse from the Iowa farm country, Saturday powered the East to a ridiculously easy 29-6 victory over the West in the 31st renewal of the Shrine game before 61,000 fans.

The Iowa quarterback from Decorah completely dominated the star-studded group that included the great All-American Howard (Hopalong) Cassidy. He not only did all the passing and kicking for his team, but he carried the ball 20 times for 57 yards on the ground—nearly always in the key spots.

**Most Valuable Player**  
For his work, Reichow was picked as the most valuable player in the game. Joe Long of Stanford, playing at center for the West, was chosen as the outstanding lineman.

The first time the East got the ball they went on a 71-yard touchdown march. This drive featured Lennie Moore of Penn State who carried the ball six times during the drive for 35 yards. Reichow scored from the one and Don Schaefer of Notre Dame kicked the conversion to make it 7-0.

In the second quarter, the West scored on a five-yard plunge by Preston Carpenter of Arkansas. This 49-yard drive was featured by two passes from Quarterback Jim Contratto to End Leon Clarke, both from Southern California.

**Reichow Drives**

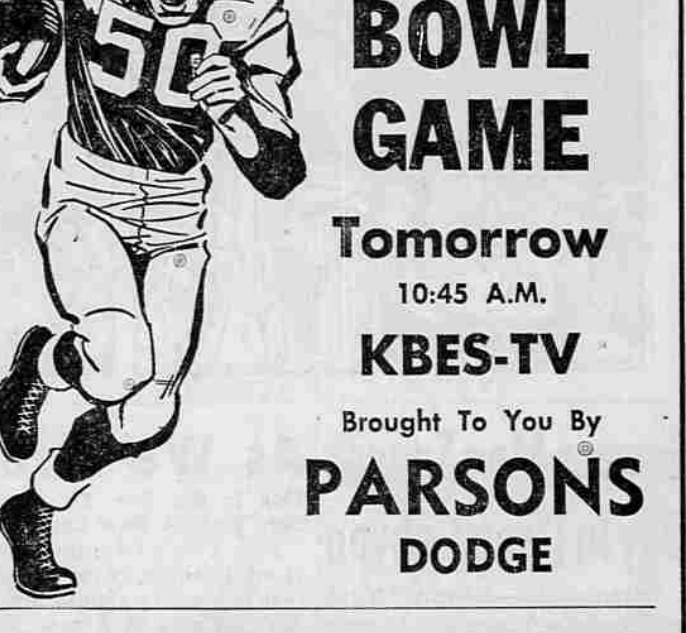
