

Expanded Foreign Aid Program Supported By Senior Republicans

Washington — (U.P.) — Senior Republicans on the Senate Foreign Relations and Armed Services committees today threw their support behind administration plans for an expanded, long-term foreign aid program.

Sens. H. Alexander Smith (R-N.J.) and Leverett Saltonstall (R-Mass.) said now is not the time for a cutback in foreign aid spending.

The foreign aid program is expected to be a major issue in the new Congress. The administration plans to request \$4,900,000,000 in new foreign aid funds—more than twice what Congress appropriated last year—although the rate of spending would continue at about the present level. Most of the increased appropriations would be for military aid.

Difficult for Nations

Saltonstall, who made a round-the-world inspection trip during the congressional recess, said in an interview that he concluded that if the United States "quits or lets down" its foreign aid program, "many free nations will have difficulty carrying on."

Saltonstall is senior Republican of the Armed Services Committee and also a senior GOP member of the Appropriations Committee.

Smith, a member of the Foreign Relations Committee, said a \$4,900,000,000 appropriations request is "not unreasonable and I think it can be defended."

Background On Foreign Aid —The Eisenhower administration took a deep cut in foreign aid spending when it came to power in 1953.

The Truman administration's last foreign aid request was \$7,600,000,000. The Republicans chopped this to \$5,100,000,000.

They explained that this was possible because of changes in

policy—both defense and foreign. And they explained it also was possible because of a big backlog of unexpended foreign aid appropriations.

Request Chopped Further

Congress thought the cut was a fine idea. And it chopped the Republican request another \$600,000,000.

That's the way the foreign aid item has been handled for the last three years. The administration has cut some, Congress some more. And the backlog has made up the difference because foreign aid expenditures have remained fairly steady.

But this year the administration has found that the foreign aid backlog is running low. More funds are needed if foreign aid expenditures are to be continued at the same level.

So, the administration wants an increase in foreign aid appropriations this year. It wants \$4,900,000,000—a boost of \$2,200,000,000. Not to spend more on foreign aid. Just to build up the old backlog and keep spending constant.

The question is whether that is what Congress wants.

Psychiatric Test Due for Peddicord

Portland — (U.P.) — Clarence Peddicord, blind 38-year-old chemist, will be given a psychiatric examination before he pleads to charges he set off dynamite in Meier and Frank department store here.

Peddicord's attorney, Nicholas Granet, told Presiding Circuit Judge Paul R. Harris of the examination yesterday. The judge delayed Peddicord's arraignment until Jan. 17.

Joyce Keller, 28, also indicted on the bombing charge, is scheduled to be arraigned tomorrow.

Stevenson Schedules Speech in Portland

Portland — (U.P.) — Presidential hopeful Adlai Stevenson yesterday notified Oregon Democrats he had accepted their invitation to make the annual Jefferson-Jackson speech in Portland on Feb. 11.

State Democrat Chairman Howard Morgan says the invitation to Stevenson to speak was extended last August, before the former Illinois governor had declared himself a candidate for the presidential nomination.

Morgan emphasized that Stevenson's acceptance of the invitation to enter the Oregon primary, although that subject is still under active discussion at Stevenson's Chicago headquarters.

Morgan said Sen. Wayne Morse had already announced that he will attend the dinner, unless otherwise detained in Washington.

Three Escape Injury In Airline Mishap

Cascade Locks, Ore. — (U.P.) — Paul Ray Lott, Fairbanks, Alaska, and his two passengers escaped injury here yesterday when Lott's Cessna 140 plane nosed over in wet snow while trying to land at the Cascade Locks emergency landing strip.

Passengers in the plane were Lott's six-year-old son, Alfred, and James Tomlinson, 17. Lott apparently was heading west when he decided to turn back due to overcast and fog, according to state police.

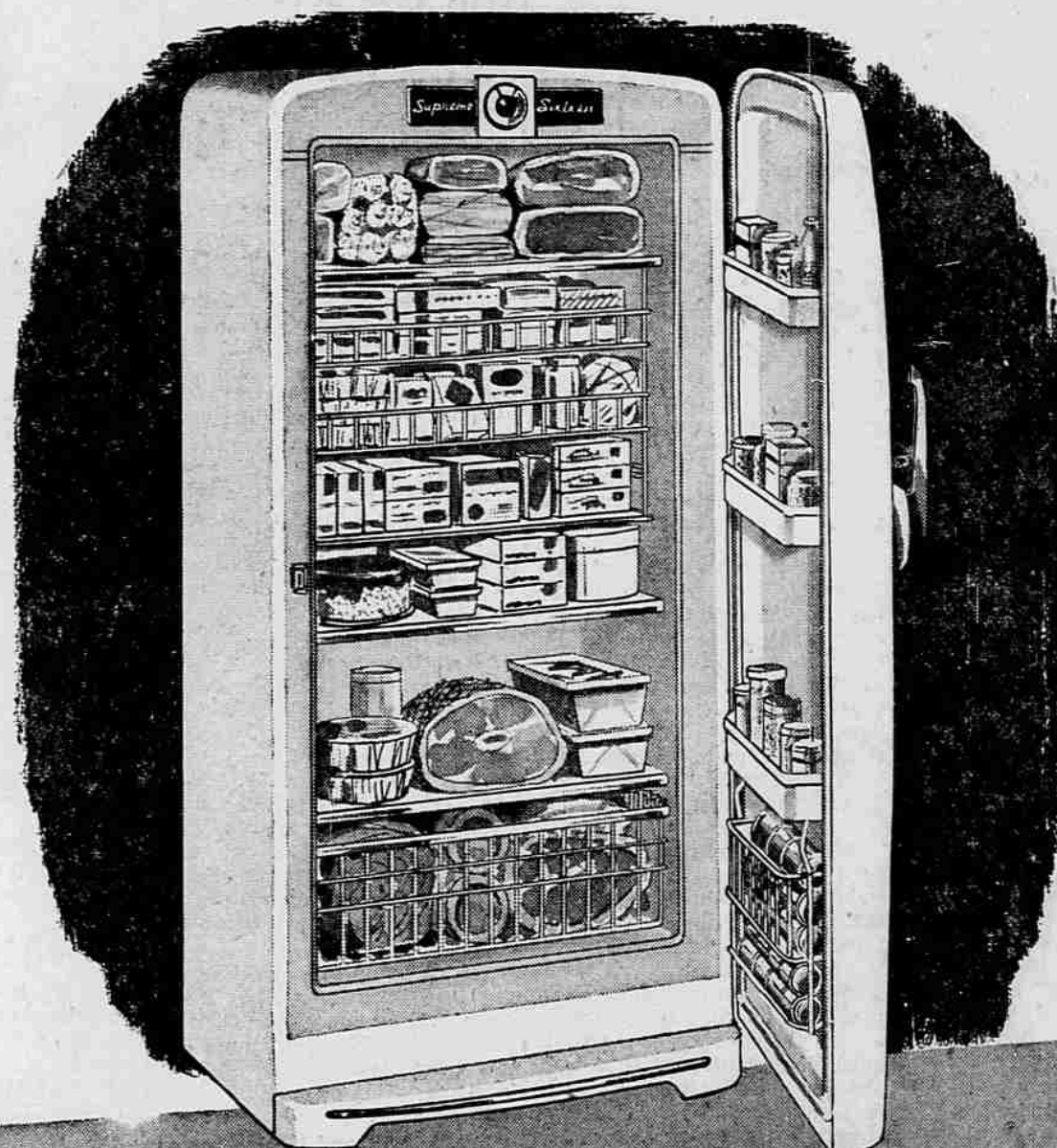

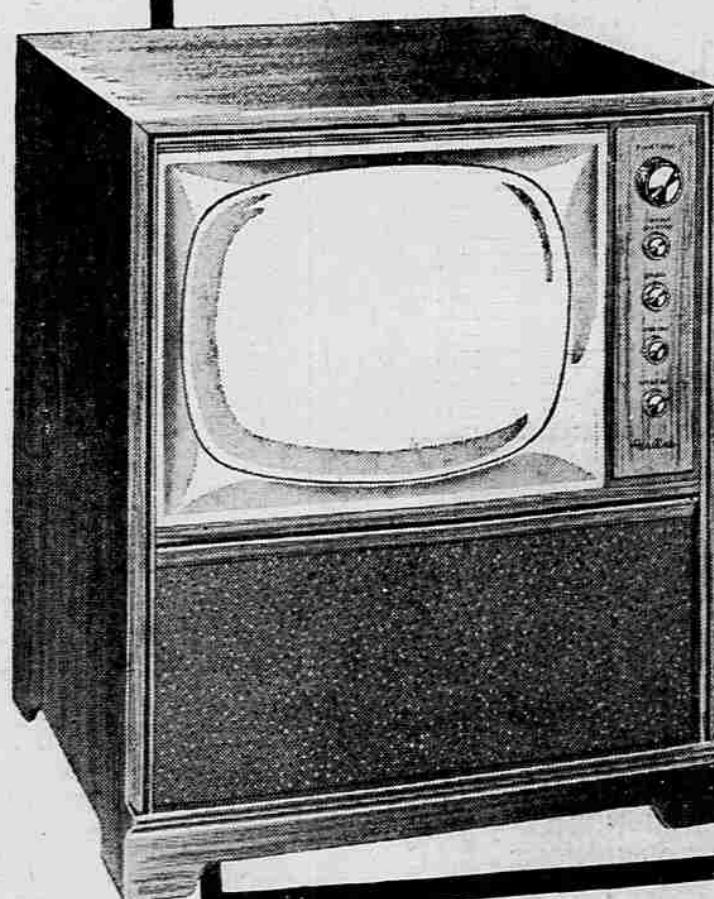
