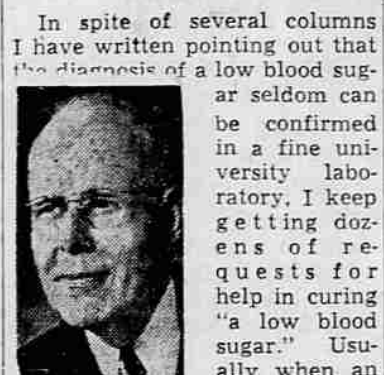

The Medical Roundup

A LOW BLOOD SUGAR



In spite of several columns I have written pointing out that the diagnosis of a low blood sugar is seldom confirmed in a fine university laboratory, I keep getting dozens of requests for help in curing "a low blood sugar." Usually when an

measurement. To illustrate: A little woman of 4 feet 6 inches can be perfectly normal, as is a man 6 feet 6. They are just variants of the human race.

Similarly, with blood sugar: The usual range of normal with the commonly-used chemical technique is 80 to 120 mg. per 100 cc. of blood. But a person with 70 mg. need not be abnormal, and he cannot get symptoms because of his slightly lowered blood sugar. It has been proved that symptoms do not appear until the blood sugar gets down to 50 mg.

Quizzed Carefully
I remember a woman who, years ago, taught me much about the ranges of normal for the different tests we use. She was a strongly-built woman with piles which each day bled so badly that she had left in her veins only 50 per cent of the normal amount of hemoglobin (the important red coloring matter in her blood). I quizzed her

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carefully but she maintained that this marked degree of anemia had not bothered her a particle. She felt perfectly strong and well and she did all her housework and washing and ironing without fatigue.

Because of many such experiences, now when a woman comes in and tells me that her doctor has been inclined to ascribe all of her aches and pains and nervousness and tired feelings to hemoglobin reading of 85 per cent, I have my doubts. To my way of thinking, this reading is well within the range of normal, and hence I start hunting for some other cause for the symptoms. I may be wrong, but this is the conclusion I have reached after years of study of the problem.
