

## Klamath Commission Hearings Scheduled

Klamath Falls — (U.P.) — Nelson Reed, Oregon chairman of the joint Oregon-California Klamath River commission, announced yesterday the dates for public hearings on the proposed Klamath river compact.

Reed said public hearings would be held here May 1-2, in Yreka May 8, in Weaverville May 14 and in Eureka May 22.

Before the public hearings begin, comments and objections from state and federal agencies will be heard in Salem, Ore., April 10-11 and in Sacramento, Calif., April 17-18.

Public hearings originally were scheduled for later this month, but were postponed because of flood conditions in northern California and southern Oregon.

## Thailand Army Will Use A-Weapons

Bangkok, Thailand — (U.P.) — U. S. and Thai military authorities have agreed to boost the Thai army strength to 80,000 fully equipped men, a high Thai military official said today.

Lt. Gen. Kharb Kunjara, deputy chief of staff of the Thai National Defense Council, said the boost would bring Thailand's present seven regimental combat teams to ten.

In an exclusive interview with United Press, Kunjara said Thailand's present seven regimental combat teams each have 8,000 fully equipped men. In addition there are 15,000 auxiliary troops.

## Signature May Extend Brazil's State of Siege

Rio De Janeiro — (U.P.) — Only the signature of acting President Nereu Ramos was needed today to extend Brazil's "state of siege" until Jan. 26, five days before Juscelino Kubitschek takes over as president.

The Chamber of Deputies approved the government sponsored extension on Saturday and the Senate completed congressional action on the measure Monday night by approving it, 32 to 12.

## Fulton Lewis Faces Libel Suit Threat

Richland — (U.P.) — Mrs. Pearl Wanamaker said today she had "no comment" on an apology made to her by Fulton Lewis Jr., who erred in a Friday night broadcast and linked her with Communism.

"I'll have no comment on this matter until I return to my Olympia office Thursday when I plan to hear a transcription of Lewis' Monday broadcast," she said.

The white-haired director of Washington's public school program threatened Lewis with a libel suit after he linked her with Communism in his broadcast last Friday night.

Last night, the news commentator apologized for making an error concerning Mrs. Wanamaker. He offered her 15 minutes of network airtime to help correct his error.

Lewis telegraphed Mrs. Wanamaker during the week-end that he was "horrified" to discover he had mistakenly said things about her.

## Dulles Will Visit New Delhi in March

New Delhi — (U.P.) — Secretary of State John Foster Dulles will visit New Delhi in March for personal talks with Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru, informed sources said today.

The sources said Dulles wants to meet Nehru and discuss many questions of importance, but further details were not known.

Dulles recently was heavily criticized in the Indian press for allegedly supporting Portuguese "colonialism" on the Indian subcontinent.

The criticism stemmed from a joint statement issued by Dulles and Portuguese Foreign Minister Dr. Paulo Cunha in Washington referring to the Portuguese possession of Goa as a "province."

Indian newspapers filled their editorial columns for days with attacks on Dulles and said his use of the term "province" backed Portuguese claims to Goa.

## SP Hauls Children To Reedsport School

Reedsport — (U.P.) — The Southern Pacific's "schoolhouse" special swung into operation yesterday carrying 131 school children past a slide-blocked section of highway 38.

The youngsters, usually transported to school from their scattered homes by bus, were happy over what was their first train ride for many of them.

The train picks up the youngsters about a mile south of Highway 38 where they are brought by school bus. The slide area is on the highway about a mile east of Reedsport.

SP officials said the service to school would be continued with an engine and two steam heated coaches until the half-mile of muck could be cleared from the blocked highway.

Meanwhile, loggers of the Long-Bell and E. K. Wood company plants here were getting to work via emergency ferries.

## Peiping Said Worried By Soviet Influence

London — (U.P.) — Diplomatic reports from Peiping said today Communist China is worried that Russia may usurp Chinese influence in Asia and that Soviet offers of aid may turn out to be at China's expense.

The reports said Peiping's suspicions were aroused by the Asian visit of Premier Nikolai Bulganin and Communist party chief Nikita Khrushchev since their's was an out and out move to extend Soviet influence.

Behind the fear of extended Soviet influence is the double fear that any aid given to other Asian nations may be at the expense of the Chinese Communist regime. Peiping was reportedly very concerned about such diplomacy.

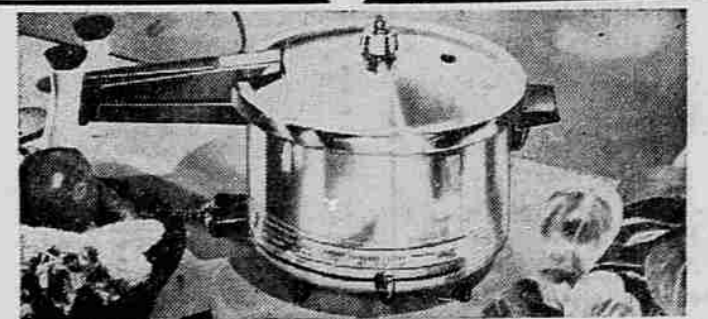
