

Adult Course, Children's Work Activities Told

An area-wide worker's training course is being planned at the Medford Assembly of God, 1108 West Main st., to begin on Jan. 23 and to continue each night through Jan. 27.

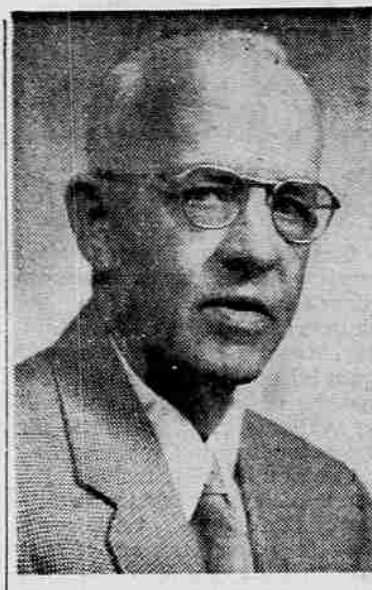
The Woman's choir will sing at the service and the pastor will be speaking on the theme, "A Voice in the Wilderness." A nursery is provided.
