New York—Pilot Capt. Robert Francis on safely landing his Northeast Airlines plane with 24 aboard after his instruments were knocked out during a snowstorm:

Soil Conservation District Endorses Area Flood Control

The board of supervisors of the Sams Valley-Beagle Soil Conservation district have endorsed a resolution asking Army engineers and other interested agencies to prepare a flood control survey of Rogue river and its tributaries.

A copy of the resolution, which has been supported by Chambers of Commerce in Jackson and Josephine counties, will be sent to Oregon's congressional delegation and other officials.

New Members
The board named four new members to a rivers committee, which is formed jointly with the Rogue soil conservation district. They are John N. Winton, Eagle Point; Burdett L. Dodge, Hillcrest rd.; and Eric Allen, and the Rev. George Bolster, Medford.

Other members of the committee are Harold Gebbard, Central Point, chairman; Francis Kraus, Applegate; and William L. Jess and Miles Williams, members of the Rogue district.

A report from the committee emphasized a need for channel clearance and stream bank erosion control, which could immediately alleviate further losses of good farm land. Considering time necessary to make a survey of valley streams and control flooding, the committee said other forms of control were important at the present time and would also control flooding.

A program of needs for such control measures is to be sent to members of Congress this week.

Members of the board also unanimously endorsed the national administration's nine-point soil bank program, as outlined in the president's message to congress.

Hearings Slated On Two Petitions For Soil Districts

The soil conservation committee will hold hearings Feb. 3 for farm owners and operators of the Evans creek area who have petitioned to join two different soil conservation districts.

The state committee has received two petitions, one signed by 34 land owners asking that their area be added to the Sams Valley-Beagle district, and one signed by 24 land owners requesting the same territory be added to the Rogue district.

Approximately 168,840 acres of land in the northwestern part of the county is not now included in either the Rogue or Sams Valley-Beagle districts.

Hearing Times
Since the petition for addition to the Sams Valley-Beagle district was presented to the committee first, a hearing on that petition will be held first. It is scheduled to begin at 1:30 p.m. Friday, Feb. 3, in the Enterprise Grange hall, Wimer, followed by a hearing on the Rogue district petition at 3 p.m.

Land operators may express three categories:

1. In favor of addition of the entire area to either the Rogue or the Sams Valley-Beagle districts.

2. In favor of dividing the territory and recommending part for addition to both districts.

3. In favor of allowing the entire area to remain as it is without addition to either.

Should the hearings favor addition to either district in whole or in part, the state committee will announce a date for a referendum vote.
