## Seven Agencies Share County Insurance

Seven Jackson county insurance agencies will share insurance coverage of county buildings and equipment this year. Under a plan announced yesterday by the county court, the insurance will rotate among members of the Jackson county association of insurance agents, with seven members writing the policies each year.

Last year one company wrote the policy, with members dividing the premium.

Property valued at \$1,440,000 is insured by the county, with premiums due each year on \$288,000. Annual payment is \$5,082.20. Policies include fire, extended coverage and malicious mischief.
