Church of God Film To Be Shown Sunday

"Heaven to Earth," a new religious historical motion picture, will be shown Sunday at 7:30 p.m. in the main auditorium of the First Church of God, Haven and Holly sts. The film was produced to highlight an international diamond jubilee year in the Church of God, according to the Rev. Darold H. Jones, local pastor.

The 42-minute picture presents a look at the work and spirit of leading pioneers in the early days of this religious group. It covers the years from 1880 to 1907 when the body was taking form under the leadership of Daniel S. Warner and other pioneers.

This religious group has developed from a handful of pioneers 75 years ago into a body of people counting 121,655 constituents in 2,141 congregations. Church school enrollment has reached 216,032.

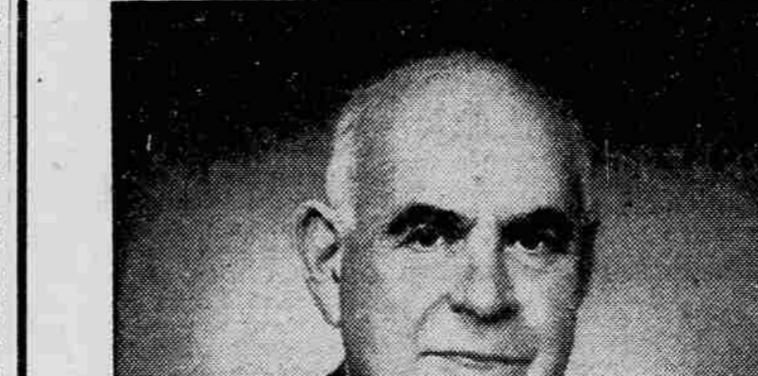
