NEW STUDIES ON BRAIN AND NERVOUS SYSTEM

A great day is dawning for research in diseases of the brain, and this includes neuroses, psychoses (mental ailments), epilepsy and mental retardation.

According to some of my older and more old-fashioned psychiatrist friends, little that was of any use to insane patients came out of such theorizing.

In recent years laboratory-trained neurologists and epileptologists have shown clearly that in the cases of some brain diseases like epilepsy the early analytic theories of causation were silly.

to work—with a tablet of dextroamphetamine or some similar drug that acts on the brain. Experts in the new field of scientific and physiologic psychiatry tell me that, so far as they can see, much of the weird structure of theory that was set up by Freud is now coming tumbling down.
