FINE WOMEN WHO ENTER DOMESTIC SERVICE

I am always sorry when I find that something I have said in a column has hurt some person who has misunderstood me. For instance: Here comes a letter from a well-educated woman who thinks I spoke of all domestic servants as "illiterate." I had no such idea. It takes a fine devoted, intelligent and hard-working woman to cook well and to keep a home neat and clean and comfortable.

Recently I wrote a column on home-making in which I quoted Dr. Jennie Rowntree's statement that this is "making love visible." Since then, Mrs. Estelle Mintz has pointed out to me that the thought of work being love made visible was expressed by Gibran in his remarkable book, "The Prophet." As he said, "And if you cannot work with love . . . it is better that you should . . . sit at the gate of the temple and take alms of those who work with joy."

I sometimes say to a woman patient — some lonely woman whose husband and children are no longer with her — that she might be much happier and better-off keeping house for someone and helping with the care of children. In such work she, each month, could save most of her salary. There is many a business woman, often a widow, who has a hard time finding a housekeeper who will set her free each day to go to work in a business place. There is many a widower with children who is in the same predicament. In the same city are widows who need perhaps money, or more important, work that will make them happy and less lonely.

I have known many a fine woman who, soon after taking over the duties of housekeeper in the home of kindly, well-to-do people, became so liked and trusted by them that her life turned out to be happy, with her position assured for the rest of her days.

A while ago, Mrs. Ann Carroll Herman, of Forest Hills, New York, wrote me saying how pleased she was with the thought that a home can be a place where love is made visible. As she said, the monthly journals are full of articles on the decoration of a home, on better cooking, and on how to do this and that, but few writers have pointed out that one of the greatest things that a woman can do in her home is to make her love visible to her husband and her children.



Poujade Fined For Libeling Schneider

Paris — (U.P.) — Pierre Poujade, extreme rightwing leader of France's anti-tax movement, was fined 500,000 Francs (\$1,428) Saturday for libeling outgoing National Assembly president Pierre Schneider.

Poujade was convicted specifically of repeating libels made by one of his lieutenants during the recent French election campaign.

It was the second blow suffered by Poujade in two days. A credentials committee of the new assembly recommended Friday night that the chamber invalidate the election of four of the 51 Poujadists who won seats in the Chamber of Deputies.

Manila — (U.P.) — Two unidentified Christians were beheaded by a group of Illogot headhunters in the mountains of Nueva Vizcaya province of Northern Luzon, it was reported Saturday.

Juan Castro, chief of a railway survey crew, reported to Army authorities that the victims were beheaded Tuesday while working at a lumber mill in Santa Clara Village. Castro said he presumed the heads were needed as a "dowry" by a bridegroom in accordance with traditions of the Illogots.
