The meeting was called to order by last year's president, Jane Grubb. Glenda Branch was elected the new president.

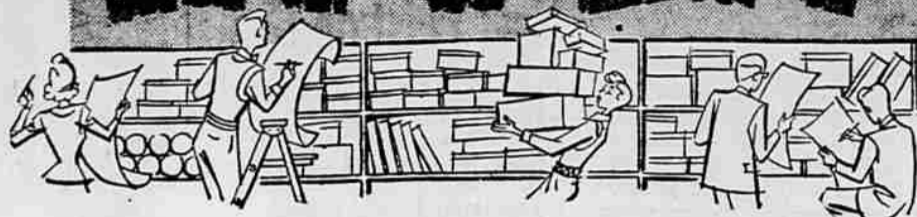
