

Back Stairs: Adams Likes Fling With Boys

Washington—Backstairs at the White House:

It turns out that Sherman Adams, the assistant to the President, likes to get out with the boys occasionally in a manner belying his legendary flinty exterior.

Adams was the "fall guy" this week for the Washington chapter of the circus Saints and Sinners. He gushed from a high-level farm conference at the White House to attend the lunchtime hilarities at the Statler Hotel.

And what was awaiting the august New Englander when he arrived? A fetching cooch dancer who twirled her tassels clockwise, as well as counter-clockwise.

Adams, however, by-passed the hip-swinging sidshow and made straight for the head table where for two hours he was roasted, basted and barbecued by club members in a series of skits.

The point of one skit was that the Eisenhower administration had figured a way out of the farm price dilemma—to sell the government's mountain of surplus agricultural commodities to the Ford Foundation.

Harry Herschfeld, the beloved New York humorist, cartoonist and perennial toastmaster, swears this is a true story about President Eisenhower. In fact, Harry says the President told him personally that the tale is an accurate one:

During World War II, just before a major allied operation on the European continent, the then General Eisenhower called British Field Marshal Sir Bernard Montgomery into consultation.

General Eisenhower told "Monty" that a division of British troops had to reach a certain point on the front "exactly on schedule."

The general pronounced the word "skedule" in the accepted American manner, but Monty objected.

"No, no," protested the field marshal. "You have it wrong. The proper pronunciation of the word 'skedule' (the customary British manner). Where in the world did you learn such atrocious pronunciation?"

"I learned it back in Kansas in grammar school," said General Eisenhower.

Reporters and photographers assigned to cover the "Salute to Eisenhower" dinner here last week at the Sheraton Park Hotel are still burning at the Republicans who ran the affair, the hotel and anybody who had anything to do with the dinner.

The newsmen were invited to dinner. Some of the ladies and gentlemen went home and put on black tie and evening dresses, but when they appeared in the ball room and went to the tables designated on their tickets, waiters said they had been instructed to serve them no food.

The silverware, even the water glasses, were removed. By this time, the proceedings were under way and the reporters and cameramen assigned to the story were stuck with their work. Finally, someone produced a tray of cheese sandwiches, some cold shrimp and coffee in another room.

He said he would seek the nomination regardless of who else might run. Gov. Paul Patterson is considered a possible candidate for nomination.

Injunction Continued Against Fred Meyer

Portland—(U.P.)—A temporary injunction restraining Fred Meyer Inc., from selling Sunbeam Corporation products at below listed fair trade prices was continued by Circuit Judge James R. Bain here yesterday.

The order also prohibits the chain store from advertising the products at below the manufacturer's prices.

Judge Bain first issued the temporary injunction last week when Sunbeam filed suit seeking \$150,000 damages and a permanent injunction.

The company was required to post a \$25,000 bond to cover damages Fred Meyer might suffer by reason of the restraint.
