1845 POST OFFICE ISSUE HAS GOOD VALUE Among the more interesting of the so-called local postage stamps—those put out before the Federal government started using its issues—are those made by the St. Louis Post Office back in 1845.

They come in three denominations, 5, 10 and 20 cents, and since all three were made from the same plate which was intended to produce only two, there are several different varieties and, consequently, values.

The stamps are easy to recognize. Chief feature of their design is a couple of bears supporting what apparently is the seal of the city. Above it are the words SAINT LOUIS forming a peak over the denominating numeral. Below are the words POST OFFICE.

The main differences in the stamps are to be found in the 5-cent values. Originally, the engraved plate consisted of three 5-cent and three 10-cent issues.

Originally it was a barrel which some early New Englander had made, presumably by burning out a hollow log and then working down both the inner and outer sides. The bottom had been reinforced by a piece of maple fixed by hickory pegs—I guess they were hickory anyway.

Larry had found the piece in an old barn and bought it for \$5. When he was subsequently offered \$80 for it by the secretary of the local museum, he indignantly refused.
