### Fluoridation of Water

A number of persons are still puzzled about the question of adding perhaps one part of flouridation to a million part of water in cities in which there is need for this addition. Practically all health officials and dental experts have become satisfied that flouridation is good, and a study of the sickness and mortality records of cities which add flourides to their water has shown no harm has been done; but still some die-hard's keep fighting.

All those persons who would like to have the facts about the controversy should read the excellent book, "Flouridation as a Public Health Measure," edited by J. H. Shaw for the American Association of the Advancement of Science. The text is so well-written as to be understandable by laymen.

### People Who Are Too Fat

The results of estimates made by the Public Health service indicate that, in this country, between 20 and 27.3 per cent of the population are overweight by at least 10 per cent. Between 6.7 and 12.8 per cent of the same group are overweight by 20 per cent or more. As all educated persons should know today, one of the worst dangers to health and life is overweight. Few fat people can reach their three-score and ten years. Most of them die so much earlier than they should that life insurance companies do not like to take them.

### "Bargain Hunting" Is Laudable in Wife

I agree with her that she gets more for her money than she would if she bought before the prices were reduced but I have tried to point out to her that bargains are lures to get people to buy things they really don't need or want, just because they are cheap. I admit that we eat well and my wife keeps within the budget but I feel that she is using up a lot of time and energy, running to all the sales, and often coming home empty-handed. Am I being unreasonable about it?"

(A) Yes, you are being unreasonable about your wife's bargain hunting. You say she lives within her budget and that you get well because of her efforts to get good food at a reasonable price. This shows that she is a good manager and this you should commend instead of condemning.

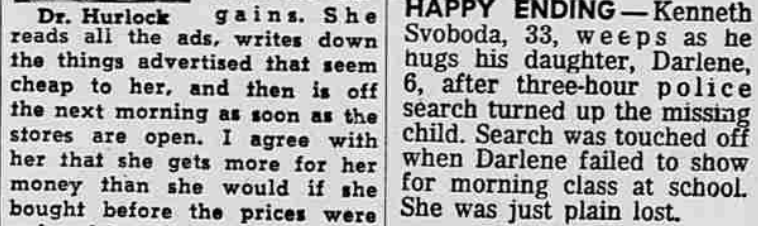
While it may seem foolish to you for your wife to rush out early in the morning to get to a store as soon as it opens, I can assure you this is necessary if she is to have any choice worth taking. There are always more buyers than there is merchandise when a sale is advertised. Those who get there first get the real pick.

Means Careful Buyer

Because your wife often comes back from sales empty-handed, it means that she is a careful buyer. She does not buy things just because they are cheap but because she sees some possible use for them and because she recognizes their value. If she bought anything and everything, regardless of whether or not she needed it, then you would have reason to complain.

Unless a family income is very large, the best way to stretch it so as to make it go as far as possible is to bargain-hunt. Your wife is doing this well and you should be as proud of her achievements as she is proud of your achievements in the business world.

## Seven Persons Hurt In Wreck Near Albany
