

Search River For AF Plane Which Ran Out Of Fuel; Two Killed

Pittsburgh—(U.P.)—The police river patrol searched the swift-moving Monongahela River here today for a twin-engine B25 Air Force bomber which ran out of fuel, crashed and sank with the loss of two lives.

The plane hit the water Tuesday afternoon about five miles southeast of Pittsburgh's Golden Triangle, where the Monongahela and Allegheny rivers join to form the Ohio River. Four Air Force men aboard were rescued, but two were missing and presumed dead.

The crash site was about eight miles downstream from where a transport ditched Dec. 22, 1954, with a loss of 10 lives. Nine of the dead were holiday-bound servicemen. That plane also ran out of fuel.

Inadequate Fuel Supply
The Air Force launched an immediate investigation to learn why the bomber, en route from Las Vegas, Nev., to Washington, D.C., apparently left Selfridge Air Force Base, Mich., its last stop before crashing, with an inadequate fuel supply.

The Air Force identified the missing as Capt. Jean P. Inghram, 29, of South Charleston, W. Va., and S-Sgt. Walter E. Soocoy, 32, of Alaska.

The survivors were listed as the pilot, Maj. William L. Dodson, commander of the Nellis AFB Weather Office; Co-pilot Capt. John Jamieson, of Mechanicsburg, Pa.; M-Sgt. Alfred J. Al-leman, 38, Nellis AFB, and Airman 2-c Charles L. Smith, 19, of Philadelphia.

The survivors had time to

scramble, onto a wing of the plane after it hit the swollen river and started moving swiftly downstream. But the wings buckled a few minutes later and the fuselage began nosing down into the water. Three of the men leaped into

the river and the two others clung desperately to the tail section to await the arrival of river patrol boats and the tugboat "Titan," which put out from the nearby Jones & Laughlin steel plant dock immediately after the crash.

The Monongahela was swollen by a recent thaw and running faster than normal when the plane crashed.

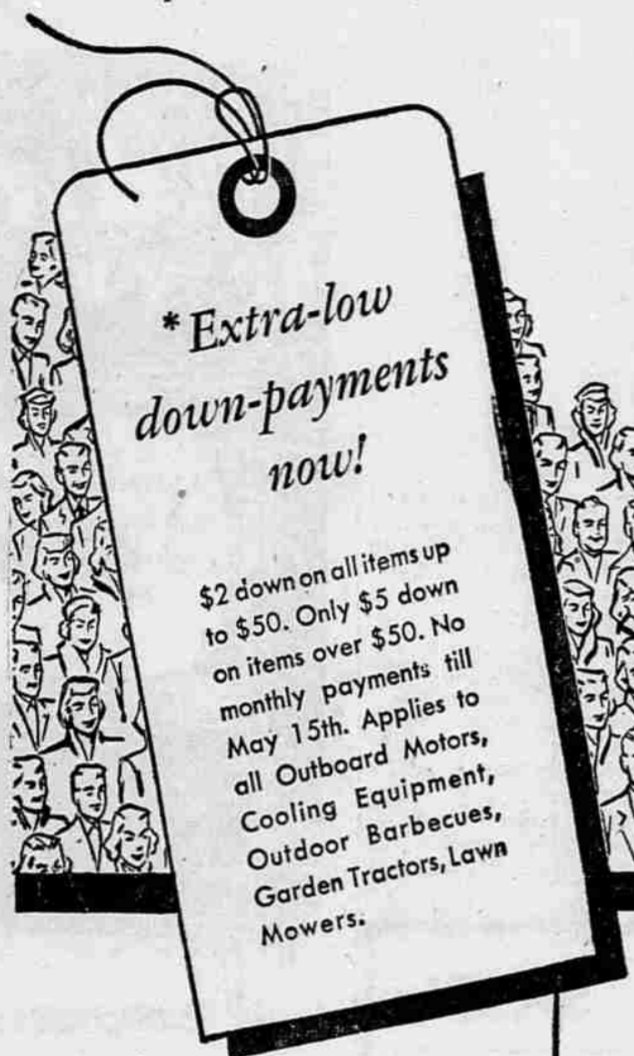

The Lane county sheriff's office reported that the boy was working with his father, George Smith, and a neighbor, James Viner, installing a new battery in the car.

The car had been propped up on wooden blocks and rocks placed to hold the wheels in place on the hillside where it was parked.

The boy crawled under the car to hold up the battery support, reached forward and took hold of the bumper to move himself forward when the car slipped off the supports crushing him beneath the front axle.

The only clue to his whereabouts the judge said, was the fact that he was known to be taking mambo lessons at a local dance hall.

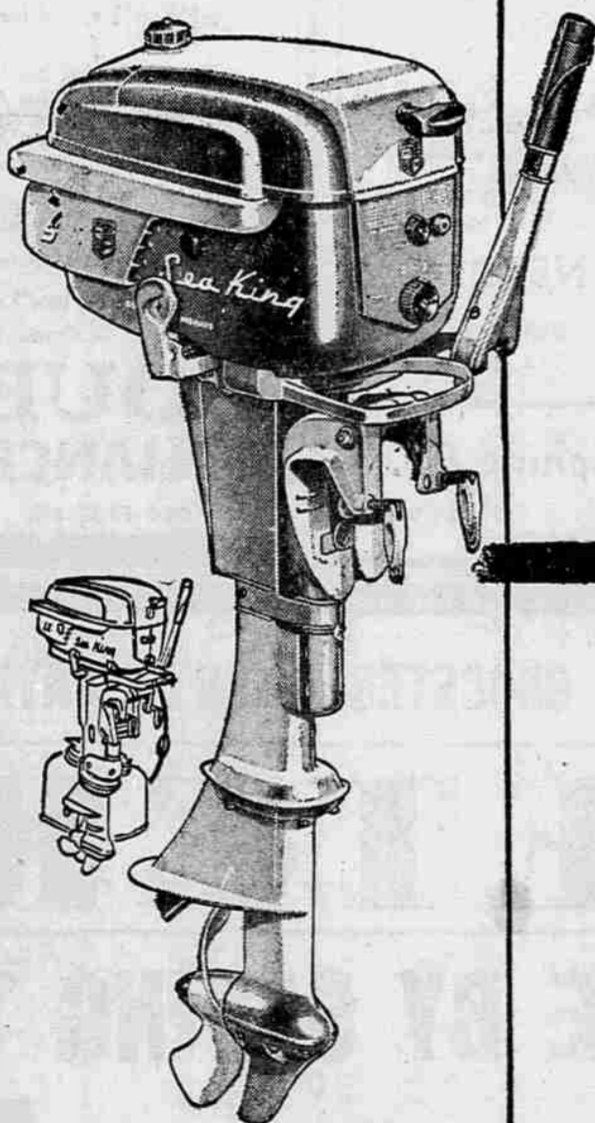
