Exchange Delegate Will Visit Here

Miss Donna Lingle, Oregon's 1955 International Farm Youth Exchange delegate to Greece, will be in Jackson and Josephine counties Feb. 4 to 12.

Miss Lingle will show slides and speak of her experiences in Greece. She grew up on a farm near Gresham and graduated from Oregon State college last spring. Varied farm experience — from hoeing weeds to sewing sacks on a combine — helped prepare her for her role as exchange delegate.

The IFYE program, a project of rural young people, was started in 1948 by farm youth who wanted to do something to help build a lasting peace, according to Miss Marjorie Hatten, county 4-H agent. IFYE delegates from the United States live and work in other countries for four to six months, and farm youth from those countries spend about the same length of time on farms in the United States. Residents in Jackson county have been hosts to four exchanges including Karen Mellum of Norway in 1953, John Whitlock of New Zealand in 1954, and two Burmese in 1955.

Red Cross officers say they have received no explanation for O'Neal's disappearance but that he had been directed to call his wife who is in a Pendleton hospital. She gave birth Saturday to their 10th child.

O'Neal had vanished shortly after the fire while in a state of shock and had said he had nothing to live for.
