The Medical Roundup

CORRECT DIAGNOSIS

Those many Americans who, when ill, regularly go to quacks and to a doctor who without a proper diagnosis makes a treatment is futile and misdirected and useless. Obviously it is much better to treat the disease that the patient has.

Great skill in diagnosis comes, first, with excellent training under able teachers in a fine and well-equipped medical school; and second, with years of study and reading and wide experience. When faced with the problem of diagnosing one of the rarer and more puzzling diseases, there is no substitute for many years of experience.

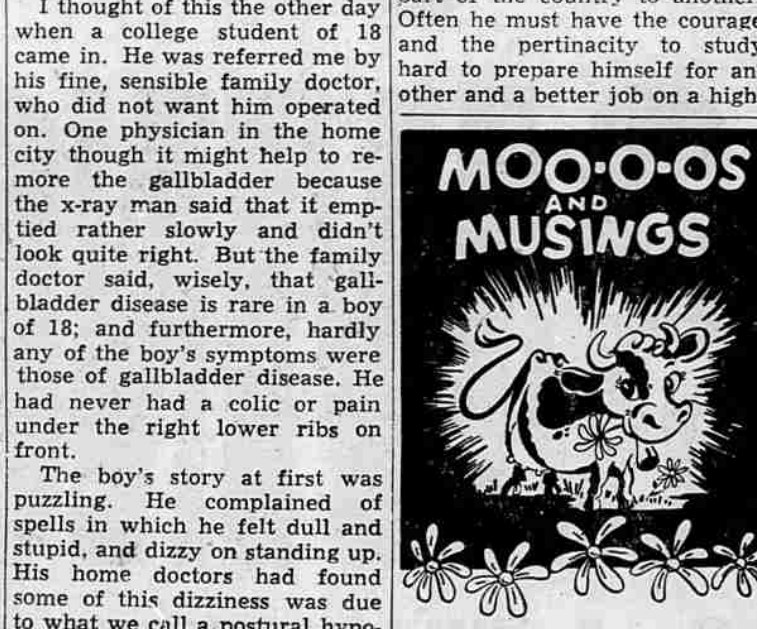
I thought of this the other day when a college student of 18 came in. He was referred by his fine, sensible family doctor, who did not want him operated on. One physician in the home city thought it might help to remove the gallbladder because the x-ray man said that it emptied rather slowly and didn't look quite right. But the family doctor said, wisely, that gallbladder disease is rare in a boy of 18; and furthermore, hardly any of the boy's symptoms were those of gallbladder disease. He had never had a colic or pain under the right lower ribs on front.

The boy's story at first was puzzling. He complained of spells in which he felt dull and stupid, and dizzy on standing up. His home doctors had found some of this dizziness was due to what we call a postural hypotension—in other words, when some frail persons stand up, the column of blood in their body is not held up enough and quickly enough so that the brain can get all the oxygen it needs. When such a person lies flat, immediately he feels well again.

The lad had an aching in his jaw, noises in his ears, a distress in his bowels, and some indigestion and bloating. Occasionally, when he felt dull and stupid he was badly constipated; and because of this, his father had wondered if he might not be suffering from poisons coming out of his bowel. At times he had heartburn, and he could get sick from eating strawberry ice cream.

From the start I was impressed by the fact that the lad could not be seriously ill, physically, because at college he was on the basketball team and was running the quarter-mile—a very hard race. I learned, also, that most of the time the lad's abdomen was comfortable and his digestion perfect.

He got his abdominal pain only when he was in one of his dull and stupid spells, when, he said, his ability to think was paralyzed. A little more questioning showed that his "stupid spells" were really devastating spells of depression, or melancholia. At times he was mildly manic, and then so lit up that he talked a blue streak, and would not sleep. Another question showed that the boy's mother was in a mental hospital with a manic depressive psychosis. I showed the lad to an able psychiatrist who agreed with me that he had a mild form of the



same mental trouble that had upset his mother.

In a case like this how wrong and useless it would have been to remove his gallbladder, or to put him on a diet, or to treat him for allergy, constipation, low blood pressure, or dizziness. The famous Benjamin Disraeli once said that "Success is the child of audacity." What did he mean by that? I imagine he meant that many a time if a man is to succeed, he must be willing to make a change, and must take a considerable risk in doing this. He may have to give up a good "bird-in-the-hand" for a bird in the bush. He may have to have the courage to give up a remunerative job that he does not like and in which he is not happy to find a job that he will enjoy. Many a man in a disliked job loses his mental health.

Sometimes a man must have the courage to move from one part of the country to another. Often he must have the courage and the pertinacity to study hard to prepare himself for another and a better job on a high-

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Processes Assure Strategic Metals

Denver—(U.P.)—A mining expert said yesterday that new processes soon may assure this nation and its allies of a greater abundance of strategic metals, including all-important manganese.

Eugene B. Hotchkiss, New York City, vice-president of the Vitrol Corp. of America, said that research also may make available new uses of our more commonly known metals and greater employment of the so-called "rare earths." Hotchkiss spoke at the National Western Mining Conference here.

Hotchkiss said that great advancements have been made already in techniques for concentrating ores and for reducing their metals to a useful state.
