MR. AND MRS. FRANK DENHAM JR.

A double funeral service for James Denham Jr. and his wife, Bessie Denham, will be held at 1:30 p.m. Tuesday, Feb. 7, in the Litwiller Mountain View chapel in Ashland. Burial will follow in the Mountain View cemetery.

Both died Wednesday in what authorities described as a murder and suicide.

Mr. Denham was born at Talent on April 23, 1911, and lived in southern Oregon all his life. He was a resident of Medford for 20 years. He served in the Pacific theater of operations during World War II, and after the war became the owner of the Rogue Distributing company.

He is survived by a brother, Lloyd Turner, Oakland, Calif.; a sister, Mrs. Mattie Driskell, Salem; two aunts, Mrs. Anna Robison and Mrs. Alice Turner, both Ashland, and three nephews.

Mrs. Denham was born Nov. 7, 1909, at Manito, Okla. Her survivors include her parents, Mr. and Mrs. R. E. Conner, Talent; two brothers, George and Ralph Conner, also Talent; and two sisters, Mrs. Verlee Howard, Dayton, Ore., and Mrs. June Brown, Spokane, Wash.

Both were graduates of Talent High school. They were married June 26, 1934.

U.S., Communists In Five Hour Confab

Geneva, Switzerland — (U.P.) — U. S. and Communist Chinese negotiators conferred for five hours here Saturday in their longest meeting since they began their marathon talks six months ago.

U. S. Ambassador U. Alexis Johnson and Communist Ambassador Wang Ing-Nan met in secret at the Palace of Nations in an atmosphere of tension heightened by the threat of new Red aggression in the Far East.

Nothing was revealed as to what went on in the closed-door session. The two envoys merely issued a two-line communique saying they had held their 35th meeting and would meet again on next Thursday.

But observers said there appeared to be no prospect of progress toward breaking the months-long deadlock in the talk.

Four Persons Killed When Fire Sweeps Home

Solon Springs, Wis. — (U.P.) — Four persons, including three children, were killed early Saturday in a fire which burned a farm home near here.

The farm home was burned to the ground by the blaze, which apparently was caused by an over-heated wood stove.
