The Medical Roundup

SENSITIVE CHEMICALS Recently, at a convention, Dr. George E. Morris, of Boston, told of one of those many persons who suffer greatly and unwittingly from some chemical with which he comes in contact in his office or shop or in the clothes he wears.

Man, during his days as a leather tanner, had become so sensitive to the chromium in the tanning bath that his hands kept breaking out. Then his feet began to break out because of con-

tact with his shoes, and for years the man could not work. He became so discouraged he took to drink. He got well when Dr. Morris got him to wear shoes made of canvas.

I remember a few women so sensitive to nylon that they could not wear nylon hose. It produced the typical picture of athlete's foot with blisters between the toes. The diagnosis became easy when a nylon brassiere produced a reddish band in the skin.

Women whose eyelids swell and appear to be inflamed must think of the possibility that a new cosmetic is causing the trouble. Many a woman gets a

red spot where her watch rests on the skin—due perhaps to a trace of nickel in the alloy.

Blondes and red heads with their extra-sensitive skins are most likely to get into trouble. I have known able surgeons who had to quit their work and go into another specialty because they could not stand the chemicals used in scrubbing their hands, and I have known be-

lievers who had to quit because their hands could not stand the chemicals used in their business.

Plantar Warts In a December 7 issue of Modern Medicine on those plantar warts on the soles of the feet that cause thousands of persons

great misery. In my experience such warts are best treated by an x-ray man who will quickly cure 8 or 9 out of ten persons. This treatment causes the patient the least expenditure of time.

I see in the symposium that some of the experts favored this method. A few like to cut the warts out or to trim them down a way, and then to apply a paste either of 30 per cent podophyllin tincture of benzoin, or

in some bad cases no treatment is entirely satisfactory. I remember when I was a boy I had one of these painful plantar warts. I took a small sharp knife and cut the thing out. I went on down until I came to tissue that hurt and bled. And the wart never came back!

waage earners rights in Oregon SOURCES OF INFORMATION Q. Isn't there a new law requiring employers to pay at least \$1 an hour?

A. You apparently refer to the Federal Wage and Hour Law which set a \$1 minimum hourly rate beginning March 1. This law applies only to employees engaged in interstate commerce or in the production of goods for interstate commerce, and there are other exemptions as well.

Q. A bad leg injury has knocked me permanently out of the trade I had for 15 years. Is there a place that can help me learn work I can do?

A. Contact the State Division of Vocational Rehabilitation Salem, which has a retraining program for workmen who cannot return to former employment because of serious injuries.

Q. I would like to earn money for college by following the harvests this year. How does one find out where and when jobs of this kind open up?

A. The Oregon State Employment Service can give you current information on demands for agricultural workers in various areas of Oregon and states of the far west during regular harvest seasons.

Q. What are some other governmental agencies which can be contacted for information in their respective fields?

A. Unemployment Compensation Commission (Salem); Industrial Accident Commission (Salem); State Board of Conciliation (211 Alderway Bldg., Portland); State Division of Labor Elections (Salem); National Labor Relations Board (Portland); Federal Mediation Service (Portland); Veterans Employment and Veterans Re-employment Rights (Portland).
