## The Medical Roundup

### MEDICAL INSURANCE

Dr. Robert A. Moore, president of the Association of American Medical Colleges, recently remarked that medical insurance is becoming like auto insurance, with a certain amount deductible. With such insurance the owner pays the first 50 or 100 dollars and the insurance company picks up the rest of the bill.

What is needed tremendously in America today is more catastrophic health insurance. Most of us can pay an ordinary doctor's bill but few of us can pay for the months of illness and hospitalization that follow a fractured hip or a bad auto accident. Fortunately, there are a number of insurance companies which sell such insurance. Any good insurance broker ought to be able to get persons into this type of policy.

### Ovaries Have Value

In these days when surgeons often remove a middle-aged woman's normal ovaries with the idea that after her child-bearing days are over she does not need them, and in the meantime she might get an ovarian cancer, it is good to read that Dr. George C. Griffith, of Los Angeles, disagrees. He recently warned the members of the American Academy of Obstetrics and Gynecology that removal of the ovaries can do harm to the blood vessels and circulatory system. He said that the ovaries are not useless to a woman after the menopause; they still have healthful functions.

### Labor Leaders Face Test of Harmony

Miami Beach—U.P.—The nation's top labor leaders face a major test of unity and harmony today in the first conference of the AFL-CIO Executive Council since its historic merger last year.

The labor leaders are meeting in the "hostile" ground of Miami Beach's vacation playground where 23 swank hotels have blocked union attempts to organize.

The council, publicly torn by personal rivalries and basic labor policy stumbling blocks, will discuss such problems as labor organization, election, political action, strike settlements, automobile workers' layoffs and the anti-segregation amendment.

AFL-CIO President George L. Meany singled out the labor problem of organizing non-union workers as one of the most important.

"We're out to organize the unorganized," Meany said.

The meetings were arranged by the last session of the Atlantic Council on Dec. 16; they will include an examination of both military and economic aspects of western defense.

### Campaign Planned To Unify Egyptian Dress

Cairo, Egypt—(U.P.)—Badelat Elboghadi, minister of municipal and rural affairs, hinted today at a sartorial campaign to unify Egyptian clothing.

Elboghadi, who has face-lifted many Egyptian cities, appointed a committee to study ways and means of unifying outdoor dress which ranges from western business suits to Arabian burnouses.

### Vets Asked To Report GI Insurance Changes

An increasing number of death cases in which the beneficiary of GI Insurance proceeds was in doubt because the insured veteran had failed to designate a beneficiary is noted by the Veterans Administration.

"Every GI insurance policyholder should make sure the Veterans Administration has been notified of the beneficiary or beneficiaries whom the proceeds of the policy," said S. T. Brannock, Officer in Charge of the Medford, Veterans Administration office.

Brannock added that any beneficiary changes which the policyholder wishes to make from time to time should also be recorded with the Veterans Administration Office handling his insurance accounts.

Other instances where the Veterans Administration should be notified of beneficiaries, Brannock said, are upon reinstatement of lapsed GI insurance or conversion of term insurance to a permanent plan policy.

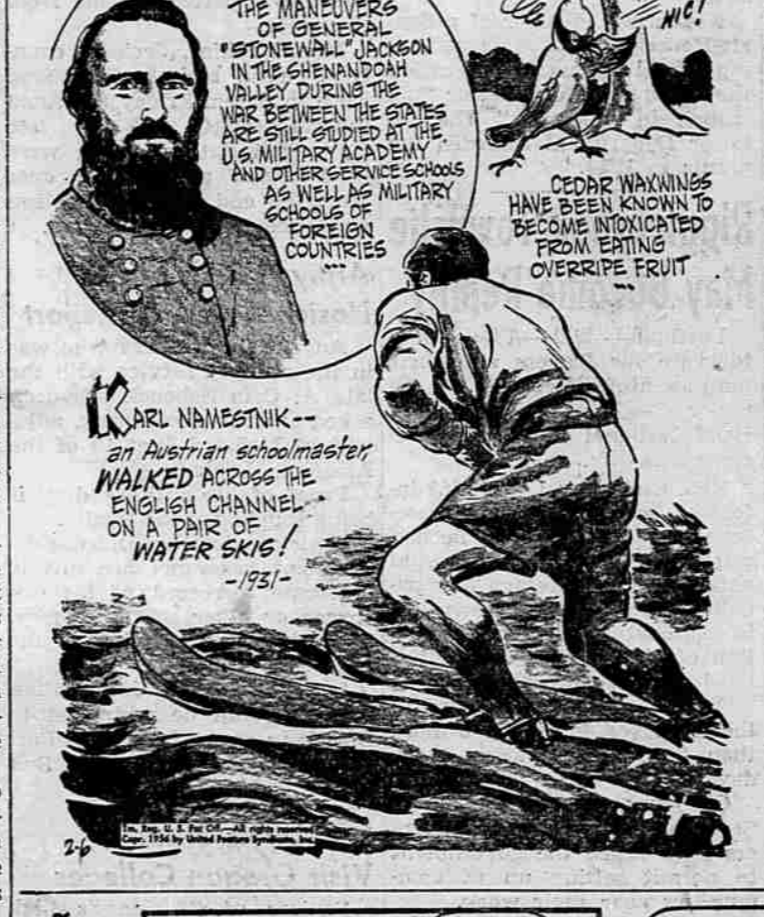
