

Five Children Die In Flaming House

Kalamazoo, Mich. — (U.P.) — Five small children died of suffocation in a flash fire late yesterday while clinging to each other on a living room sofa.

A sixth child and an adult suffered burns, a woman was injured in a leap from a second-story window and an elderly roomer was burned critically. Another child was rescued by a window.

Firemen said they found the five victims huddled on the couch with their arms entwined. They were identified as Vicky Dungey, 6, her sister, Sherry, 4, and her brother, Eugene, 3; Naomi Trice, 4, and her brother, Harold, 3.

Harry Beadle, 87, a roomer, was in critical condition today from burns suffered when he and five-year-old Diana Dungey were pulled through a window while flames raged through the nine-room frame house.

Ether, Connor, 33, another roomer, injured a leg in a jump from her second-floor window. Gilbert Peake, 71, owner of the house, said the fire broke out shortly after he found the children playing with a gas stove in the kitchen. He ran for help but the children suffocated before firemen arrived.

Peake said the parents of the children, Mr. and Mrs. Herman Trice and Mrs. Richard Dungey, were at work at the time. The Trices rented the house and the Dungey children stayed with them during the day.

Articles by SOC Faculty In Education Quarterly

Ashland — Articles by Southern Oregon college faculty members, Dr. J. D. McAulay, chairman of the education department, and Miss Florence P. Allen, field supervisor of teaching, appear in the fall issue of the Teacher Education Quarterly published by the Connecticut state department of education.

Miss Allen's article, "An Experiment With the Cycle Plan in Intermediate Grades at the Southern Oregon College of Education," is based on a study concerning several children who remained with the same teacher through a three year period and a group who had a different teacher each year.

Study findings indicated that children in the three year group with one teacher apparently made better scholastic, social, and emotional growth than the

control group with a change of teachers each year.

Experience Program

"A September Experience Program," the article by Dr. McAulay, outlines a program in the preparation of elementary teachers which has been in successful operation at Southern Oregon college for two years.

To overcome beginning teachers' weaknesses in the preparation of materials for the first week's lessons for September, all students about to begin student teaching or who have had one or two quarters of student teaching, enter the classroom of an experienced teacher as soon as school opens in the fall. They remain in that particular school until college classes start.

Six Jets Crash On British Flight

Swaffham, England — (U.P.) — Six of Britain's newest jet fighters cracked up today in a follow-the-leader disaster that killed one pilot.

A flight of eight Hawker Hunter fighters hit sudden bad weather during a long training flight over Eastern England, and didn't have enough fuel to ride it out.

Four pilots bailed out one after another, leaving their jets to crash unmanned. A fifth cracked up during an emergency landing at nearby Marham field.

The sixth crashed out of control into a field. The pilot may have been trying to ride it out to get his plane away from villages below. He was killed in the crash.

Two other planes in the flight landed safely.

The Hunters, single-engine jet fighters, were nearing the end of a long flight when the weather "suddenly deteriorated," the Air Ministry said. It was believed they ran out of fuel.

Supervisors Accept Hospital Annex Bid

Yreka—The Siskiyou county board of supervisors has voted to accept a bid of \$98,860, submitted by Al Giordano, Yreka contractor, for construction of a new hospital annex.

The building will be complete with partitions, plumbing, glazing and insulation, but the bid price does not include fixtures, trim, paint, plaster and millwork.

The supervisors earlier referred the bid to the purchasing agent, Jess O'Roke, for consideration, who favored awarding the contract. The bid was divided into two sections in order that the board might start construction with available finances.

Additional finances will be available after July 1 this year, the start of the new fiscal year.

O'Roke said total cost of the building probably would be about \$150,000, which would leave about \$50,000 to be budgeted.

Shakespearean Actor Succumbs at Denver

Denver — (U.P.) — George Sommes, Shakespearean actor, Hollywood director and a figure in the American theatre, died at home yesterday after a long illness.

Sommès was the husband of Helen Bonfils, an executive of the Denver Post. They formed the firm of Bonfils & Sommes 20 years ago, and produced Broadway shows in New York.

Sommès appeared on Broadway before World War I, and in 1914 became the first American to portray important Shakespearean roles with the Old Vic Repertory Company in London. He served as a sergeant in the American Army during World War I.

In 1929 Sommes went to Hollywood, and during the next five years directed such well known film stars as George Raft, Gary Cooper and Sylvia Sydney.

In 1936 he became director of the Elitch Summer Theatre in Denver, and later that year married Miss Bonfils.

Japanese Farmers Group Closely Watching Eggs

Tokyo — (U.P.) — The Japanese Farmers Rehabilitation association is hatching 150 dozen chicken eggs, donated by a California organization, on an isolated farm this year to make sure they don't meet the fate of a similar shipment last year.

The last shipment of 130 dozen eggs was hardly fit for hatching after strict Japanese quarantine officers got through with them. They had them boiled.

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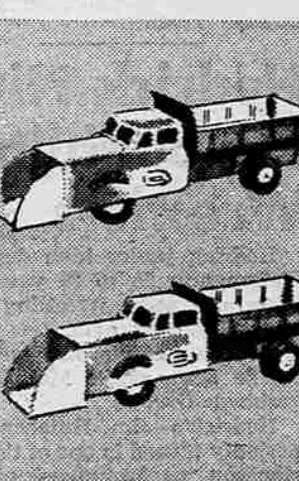

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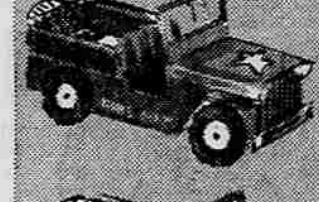

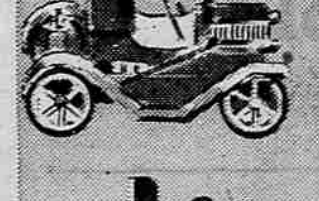
