

Gold Hill Council Considers Several Items at Meeting

Gold Hill—Gold Hill city councilmen met on Monday night for regular session with all members present but one.

Mrs. Fred Goodwin appeared to ask relief from drainage water on her place at west end of Second ave. The council voted to have a 12-inch drain placed across her property.

C. M. Scott appeared to complain about street and drainage near his residence on Third st. Mayor Milton Steinmetz asked the street committee to investigate.

Recorder's Conference

City Recorder Ferd Jones announced the notice of a special conference of city recorders of the state as sponsored by the League of Oregon Cities to be held in Eugene on Feb. 20-21. The council voted to send Jones to the meeting with travel expenses paid.

Tru-Mix company requested to get rock from the city gravel bar for a fill at the new school building on Second ave., with about 200 yards needed. The council voted on the proposition with Tru-Mix to make the road to the pit and leave same in good condition, and to pay the city 30 cents per cubic yard for the gravel taken and to take gravel to be used only for the new school.

The council agreed to proceed as soon as possible to correct drainage on 14th st. near the Leonard Kell residence. It also agreed to investigate possibilities of opening Fifth ave. from 14th st. to the west city limits.

It was suggested the firemen make a study of location for a fire hydrant near the new school.

Councilmen were invited to attend the meeting of firemen on Feb. 8 so the council would better understand problems relative to firemen and their equipment.

Councilman Floyd Lance presented again a previously proposed plan that the city pay one fireman \$20 per month to inspect fire equipment regularly. The council voted to have Mayor Steinmetz and Lance meet with the firemen to make an acceptable deal on this matter.

The council discussed the price of city lots in block 1 and decided to let the price of \$250 per lot stand.

Archie Price, of the firm of Cornell, Howland, Hayes and Merryfield of Corvallis, having been invited to attend, presented some preliminary information on problems of providing the city with filtered water.

Price gave his first impression on the subject, and answered questions. He will make a study of the situation and later be able to quote figures on the costs.

Ask Commission Help In Condemning Bridge

Washington—Senator Richard L. Neuberger announced yesterday he sent a telegram to R. H. Baldock, chief engineer, Oregon State Highway commission, expressing hope that the commission can help proceedings leading to the condemnation of a partly destroyed railroad bridge across Rogue River, north of Grants Pass.

The bridge is part of the California and Oregon Coast railway system, now owned by the city of Grants Pass, which has requested permission to abandon it. Abandonment is being sought from the Interstate Commerce Commission on the grounds that the railroad is inoperative, a financial burden to the city, and blocks possible development of Highway 99.

In a wire to Baldock Neuberger said, "Abandonment of this bridge will help make possible an ICC decision permitting abandonment of this short railroad."

"In my opinion, abandonment of the entire railroad, operation, including the bridge, will make possible securing a right of way for an adequate and safe new routing of Highway 99."

Air Force C47 Explodes on Takeoff

Cheyenne, Wyo. (U.P.)—An Air Force C47 en route from Norton Air Force Base, San Bernardino, Calif., to Chicago, exploded on takeoff at Cheyenne Municipal Airport early today and one of the nine military personnel aboard was killed.

The Air Force said the other eight persons aboard were hospitalized at Cheyenne for observation. None was believed seriously injured.

A spokesman at Warren Air Force Base here said preliminary investigation indicated the explosion was in the left motor. The fire was put out quickly with a hand extinguisher, he said.

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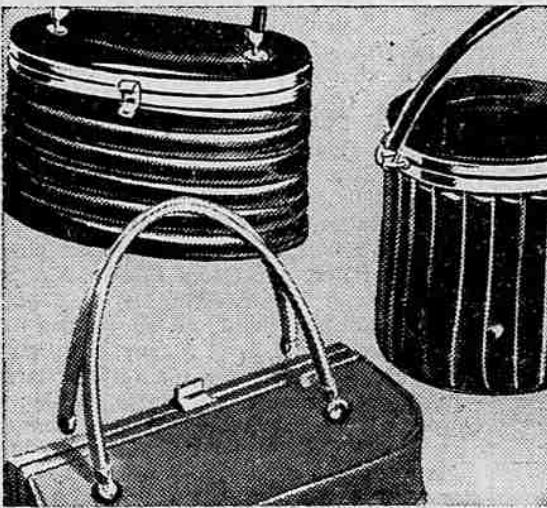

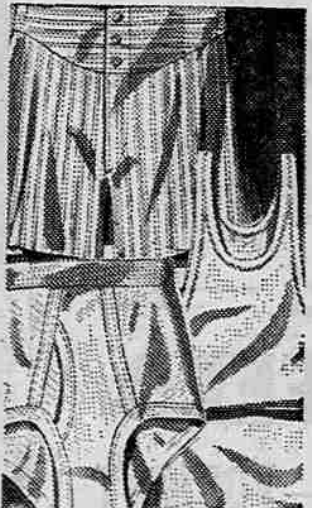

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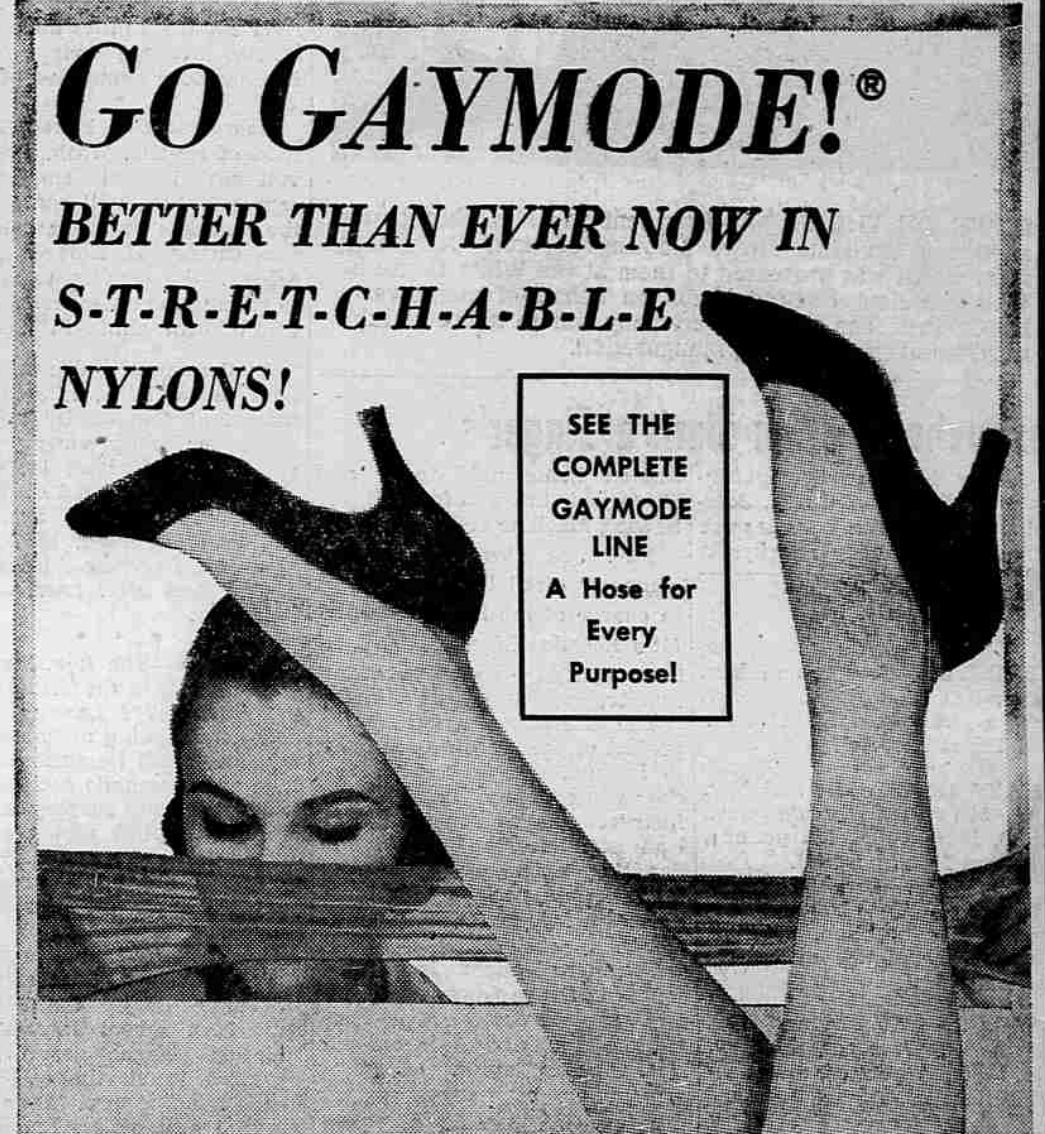
