## Garden Writer Calls Attention To Native Plants

 A visit to southern Oregon last week served to remind us of the wealth of native plant material growing in this state that is suitable for use in the home landscaping plan. Perhaps one of the most conspicuous native shrubs seen growing on the hillsides along the Pacific Highway from Grants Pass to Medford was the one we commonly call Manzanita but which, to the botanist, is *Arctostaphylos tomentosa*. At this time of year its foliage is conspicuous with its unusual yellow-green shade and, growing profusely among groves of Madrona trees (*Arbutus Menziesii*), the effect was most pleasing. Manzanita, while it does reach a pretty good size is, usually, compact, well branched and of rounded form. Manzanita is a close relative of *Arctostaphylos Uva-ursi*, commonly called "Kinnickinnick," a most useful plant as a ground cover.
