### Pony Express Rider Buried in Ashland

Ashland — Bernard S. (Snowy) Whiting, who was among the last of the Pony Express riders, was buried in Mountain View cemetery here Monday.

Mr. Whiting, who moved to Ashland in 1943, carried the United States mail for several years in Arizona—Pony Express style for about 10 years ending in 1941.

The route was a seven-mile trip over a precipitous trail between Sombrero Butte and Copper Creek in Arizona—a route started when a post office department efficiency expert noticed that the route by automobile traveled 35 miles over rough roads and that a horse could take a shortcut in much less time.

He carried the mail three times each week until the route was discontinued in 1941. He was the subject of many feature articles, film and newspaper stories because the Pony Express mail service in days of swift airplane flights intrigued readers and writers.

While in Ashland, Mr. Whiting was employed on the maintenance staff at Southern Oregon college.

### Neuberger Would Alter Clearwater Forest Name

Boston — (U.P.) — Sen. Richard Neuberger (D-Ore.), said here last night he was going to introduce legislation that would change the name of the Clearwater national forest in Idaho to honor the late historian, Bernard Devoto.

Devoto, a native of Cambridge, Mass., was best known for his study of the Lewis and Clark expedition up the Missouri river and into the Northwest.

Neuberger said the historian's ashes were to be sprinkled along the Lolo trail through the Clearwater forest this spring. The Lolo marks part of the path of the Lewis and Clark trek through Idaho.

### Women Employed To Pinch Plump Cheeks

Waynesville, N. C. — (U.P.) — Pinching plump cheeks is only a part-time activity of politicians, but it's a full time job for a group of women here.

The women are employees of a rubber company and the plump cheeks are those of halves of foam latex pillows. Edges of the halves must be pinched together after cementing.
