Airport Is Subject Of Rotary Club Talk

The Medford municipal airport during fiscal year 1955 had a total of 56,092 operations, Grant Bourquin, chief controller of the Civil Aeronautics administration here told members of the Medford Rotary club at a luncheon meeting Tuesday.

Speaking at the Jackson hotel, Bourquin said figures cited in the monthly publication of the Aircraft Owners' and Pilots' association indicated that traffic at the Medford airport was exceeded by only two European cities, Paris, France and London, England.

Civil aviation in the U.S. is living in the 25th century when compared with the rest of the world, the speaker said. Listing of airport activity shows that the Chicago Midway airport alone, the world's busiest, handles more total traffic in a year than Amsterdam, Copenhagen, Paris and Zurich combined.

Oregon Mail Carrier
The first U.S. mail carrying aircraft to enter the skies over Oregon landed at Barbour field during the 1920s. People of this community have been air minded since the first landing field was established at the old fairgrounds south of Medford, named in honor of Newell Barbour, a young Medford army pilot killed in action during World War I.

With steady development of airport facilities since that time, air transportation has become increasingly vital to the life of this city and area. In addition to the 56,092 operations shown for the 1955 fiscal year, radio contact was made by the CAA tower at the Medford municipal airport with 13,700 aircraft passing over but not landing at the local field.

So important has air-ground communications and air traffic control become, air commerce here and throughout the U.S. would be slowed to a snail's pace should these services be suddenly discontinued. This would be especially true in adverse weather conditions, Bourquin said.

Outlines Equipment
Outlining the up-to-the-minute equipment used by CAA at the Medford airport, Bourquin included low frequency radio range and VHF directional radio range used for radio navigation, instrument landing, a system for making approaches to landing area during adverse weather, and VHF directional finder which, if aircraft is equipped with two-way radio transmitter and receiver, provides approximate position and directs the pilot to the local field or orients him for other locations.

The Medford airport CAA tower also has radio transmitter and receivers for air-ground communications, teletypewriters for receiving weather reports and for transmitting and receiving flight plan information, interphone system for rapid exchange of traffic information, and many other types of equipment such as switches for airport lighting, light guns, traffic direction indicators, wind direction indicators and altimeter setting indicators.

Radar, now installed and in use in many of the busiest airports, has not yet been included in the CAA equipment here. Bourquin invited local individ-

uals and groups to visit the airport tower.

Bourquin was introduced by Shelby Tuttle, Rotary program chairman.

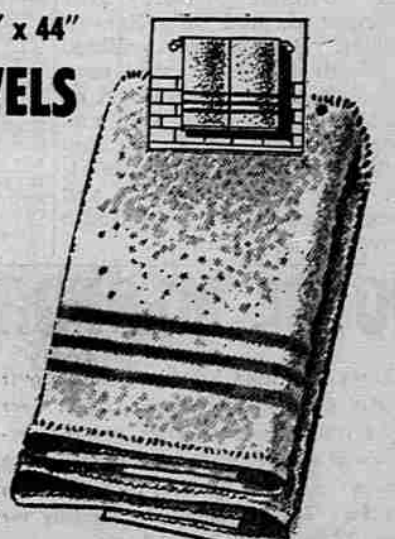
