Wall Street Journal Gives Salary Report
Eugene—(U.P.)—A starting salary comparable to that offered to college graduates in industry was announced yesterday by Bernard Kilgore, president of the Wall Street Journal.

Kilgore said the newspaper specializing in business news would offer starting salaries of \$100 per week for newsmen beginning the paper's one-year training program. He said the new scale would become effective June 1.

Kilgore told a journalism assembly at the University of Oregon school of journalism the new pay scale "compares with a national average starting pay of less than \$70 a week offered by newspapers for reporters without prior professional experience."

Portland Traction Briefs on File
Salem—(U.P.)—Briefs were on file with the State Supreme court today in the appealed case of the Portland Traction company against Charles H. Heltzel, state public utilities commissioner.

The case involves Heltzel's authority to regulate railroad schedules in Oregon. A Marion county Circuit Court decision held that the traction company was within its legal rights in curtailing operating schedules on two interurban passenger lines.

Heltzel, who appealed, contends the curtailment was in violation of his order that schedules should be retained pending an investigation and hearing.

Briefs in a similar case involving Southern Pacific railroad still are to be filed. This case involved halting of passenger train service between Portland and Ashland.

State Land Board Considering Refuge
Salem—(U.P.)—Gov. Elmo Smith said yesterday the State Land board has given exploratory consideration to the possibilities of development by the game commission of parts of Warner valley in Lake county as a wildlife refuge and shooting reserve.

Smith emphasized that it would be expected that current leases in the area to farmers would not be disturbed and that agricultural uses of land would be fully protected. He said a local hearing probably would be arranged before any action is taken.

The plan also would extend agricultural possibilities, the governor said.
