Archeology is Part Of Israeli Home Life

Benyamina, Israel — (U.P.) — The republic of Israel is only eight years old, but its department of antiquities is one of the busiest in the government.
Just about every housewife is an amateur archaeologist. The new nation's old land is a treasure chest of ancient relics which can be dug up just about at any doorstep.
A typical victim of archaeological fever is Mrs. Paula Arnold, who already has collected a blue glass jar of ancient Roman vintage, a Phoenician pot-herd and an ancient vault where bones once were placed. Mrs. Arnold says there is scarcely a home in this Israeli village without a Corinthian capital or broken pillar somewhere in a front garden.
This town is on the site of what used to be the city of Caesarea Maritima, the place founded by Herod in 25 B.C. and later made the capital of Judea by the Romans.
Anything a housewife finds above ground, she may keep. But anything dug up must be turned over to the government, which returns a portion to the finder.

LENTEN MEAL
Here's a meal-in-one dish to help the Lenten cook. It features vegetables, shrimp and rice and is flexible enough for year-round use. Use either flaked, cooked halibut, flounder, codfish, canned tuna or lobster instead of shrimp. The basic recipe for the skillet scramble is: 3 tablespoons salad oil; 1 small clove of garlic; 1½ cups packaged, precooked rice; 2 cups water; 2½ tablespoons soya sauce; 1 tablespoon monosodium glutamate; ½ teaspoon pepper; 1½ cups shredded lettuce and ½ cup chopped almonds. Heat oil in the skillet, add the garlic and shrimps and saute over low flame. Then add remaining ingredients except lettuce. Cover and cook over low heat for 10 minutes. Add lettuce just before serving.

Chicago — (U.P.) — The retail store 45 years from now will have many of the aspects of science fiction. But it will all be real to the customer.
The main floor sales space will be covered entirely by displays in the store of 2,000 A.D. and the merchandise, what little there is of it, will be contained in automatic vending machines.
This is the prediction of Raymond L. Lutgert, 36, developer of a new suburban shopping center on Chicago's South Side. Lutgert also forecasts that shopping areas at the beginning of the next century will be enclosed entirely in glass and heated for the comfort of the shoppers.
Other features of the store-

to-come, Lutgert said, will be moving sidewalks, selling by automatic clerks and machines to handle deliveries, inventories and similar chores.
