Opening performance of the Kiwanis presentation of mirth and melody will be on Wednesday night Feb. 29, at the senior high school auditorium. The show will continue Thursday, Friday and Saturday, March 1, 2 and 3.

**Holidays Reviewed**

"Holiday Review" is the title of the 1956 Kapers production and holidays of the year will be reviewed with songs, dances, gags, colorful spectacles and surprise sequences. All local talent is featured with professional direction. Rehearsals began in early February.
