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The Medical Roundup

WHY JOHNNY CAN'T READ All parents of children who have been interested in the great controversy over Rudolf Flesch's book on Johnny's reading will want to read in Time Magazine (January 9) a long article based on much study of the subject carried out all over the country by investigators. The impression I get from their report is that there is no one simple cure for every child affected. Most unfortunate is the fact that many teachers have to keep in one class children with all grades of intelligence and ability. Hence the learning pace of the class must be that of the slowest pupils.

I remember well how, in 1896, when I was in the eighth grade, we had in the classroom, jammed into small desks designed for children, a half-dozen big almost adults, aged 19, whose minds had quit growing when they were eight or ten. We had, also, a number of teen-agers, aged 16 to 17, with so low an intelligence quotient that they should have been in some vocational school, learning to work with their hands. The legislators who had decreed that the poor teacher must keep trying to put algebra into their heads were utterly stupid. Curiously, legislators do not seem yet to have learned to improve matters in this field.

Nowhere in all this discussion of poor reading have I seen a report of the kind I would like to have seen on the types of mental and psychic inheritance of

What impresses me is that "Time" tells of no adequate experiment ever carried out in which a few thousand children of average intelligence were divided into groups, in each of which the children were taught to read by one of the several methods now in use. This experiment would have to be carried out fairly by persons who were not strongly prejudiced in favor of any one method. Perhaps after such an experiment is carried out our teachers can be satisfied that one method is much better than others—for the average child. For the child with a peculiar brain that causes him to see letters reversed or jumbled, or for the child who was not born with much of a visual memory, special methods of training should be designed and tried out. Ones that do not work well should be promptly discarded. It would be interesting to see how often these peculiarities in children are inherited and how
