

PHEONIX, CRATER FINALISTS IN A-2 DIVISION TOURNAMENT

Brookings downed Henley 82-27 for fifth place in the district 6A2 southern division tournament at Central Point last night.

Central Point—Phoenix high, the champion of the Rogue League, and Crater, the runner-up, came through with Friday night victories to enter the Saturday finals in the District 6A2 southern division basketball play-offs here.

The Pirates of Phoenix pulled away in the final minutes to clip Eagle Point 47 to 35. Crater ousted Illinois Valley 64 to 51. It was the third consecutive time this season that the Comets had downed IV by that score.

Phoenix had a nip and tuck battle until three minutes were left to play. It headed only 33 to 30 at that stage but with the help of gift shots built up its final margin. Quarter scores all were in Pirate favor, 8 to 2, 17 to 14, and 29 to 25.

The Comets of Central Point were in front of the Cougars 18 to 14, 31 to 22 and 50 to 35 at the intermissions. Reserves saw about four minutes of duty for Crater in the final quarter. Regulars, however, finished the lack-luster game.

Eagle Point and Phoenix fought a tough defensive battle with both clubs doing a good job in restraining opposition. Free throws particularly aided the Eagles in the first half. Neither club was very hot from the field.

Fouls pile up. Eagle pressing on defense and driving of Don Wallace on offense for Phoenix were factors as the Pirates piled up their final spread. The EP quint, with only seven personal infractions against it in 29 minutes of play, was charged with six misdeeds in the closing three minutes.

Wallace made good on five of six free tries, himself. Jim Korth of Phoenix and Jack Greb of Eagle Point were high point men with 16 each.

Fred Herrmann was the chief scorer for Crater with 22. George Plumlee had 18 for Illinois Valley. Herrmann collected 12 free counters on 15 attempts. Plumlee had a 14 for 18 night at the charity line with 13 out of 15 in the second half.

Eagle Point and Illinois Valley tangled for third place last night.

Phoenix and Crater vied in a rubber match last night. The two clubs broke even in their four Rogue League starts.
